ASKS FOR AMERICAN SYMPATHY IN PIRACY

BERLIN, October 2.—In a long article in the Tagblatt, Dr. Dernburg explains that President Wilson stands for America, as it is his duty to do. Any statesman, he says, who did not cater exclusively to the interests of his own country would deserve contempt and political annihilation. Statesmen like President Wilson, he continues, consider it their chief duty to serve the present and future prestige of the United States, increase their influence on the western continent and the adjacent seas and seek for the world's peace which would make possible the exploitation of the yet largely dormant economical forces of that vast country. This policy, doubtless very popular in America, he says, has in some cases very unfavorably affected Germany's interests, but that must not veil German eyes to American necessities if Germany wishes America to understand Dr. Dernburg continues, explaining how, when two years ago he went to America, he was astonished at the prevailing anti-Germanism, but now it was only natural in view of the Entente's press campaign and the fact that many things European look quite different when seen from the other side of the Atlantic. He thinks, however, that in time a better understanding of the developments of the war will take the edge off the unsympathetic American attitude. Such a process, necessarily being slower a country where the facts must soak through the masses of the people before a change of opinion is brought about, than in countries where the leading men are not entirely dependent upon public opinion. Thus, he believes that America's views of the war are still in the process of formation. His article concludes with the expression of the hope that America will take a more reasonable view should Germany be compelled again to renew her ruthless submarine war in order to force England to make peace. He says it was largely to please America.

that this form of warfare was renounced, with certain reservations, but there are signs that the dominating English attitude toward all neutrals has gradually changed America's views in this respect.
