ALBANY, N. Y., June 23.-Accusing District Attorney William A. Blakely of Pittsburgh with aiding Andrew W. Melton, a Pittsburgh millionaire banker, in his attempt to secure a divorce from his wife, Alton B. Parker today made a plea to Governor Dix not to honor the requisition of Governor Tener of Pennsylvania, for the extradition of Albert George Curphy and Capt. T. W. Kirkbride, residents of London, England, who are wanted to testify in the divorce proceedings.

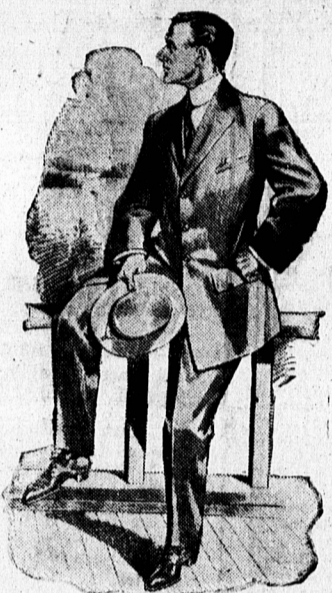
