British Flag To Come Back

SAULT STE. MARIE, Ont., April 27 - (By The Canadian Press) - Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt, of New York, has directed the return of the British flag taken from Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, by American troops in July 1814.

The flag was taken from a building at the corner of Queen and Pilgrim streets, part of which is yet standing. It was erected about 1790 by C. O. Ermatinger, the Soc's first trader, and was used by him as a trading post and warehouse.

It is interesting to recall that it was the burning of the Soc, which caused the British to burn Washington later in the year. At that time, the Soc, was one of the most important posts on the Great Lakes.

The hoisting of the old flag is scheduled as one of the events of the Soc's "Wolf Week" with a full pack of timber wolves, which is set for the last week of July.

C. N. R. Schedule Island Division Cadet Inspection And Training

With the general change in train schedules commencing Sunday, May 1st, the Canadian National Railways announce the inauguration of the double train service from and to Prince Edward Island daily except Sunday.

Examinations in Physical Training will commence at the Prince of Wales College and Normal School on the morning of Tuesday 3rd May, and will continue daily until noon on the 5th.

Two hundred and two candidates will present themselves for examination and if successful will be granted a Grade "B" Physical Training Certificate which is a necessary qualification for teachers in Canadian Schools.

The course leading up to this examination has been conducted by the Cadet Services branch of the Department of National Defence. Each student must complete a total 6,000. Admitted to the homes since their opening over 30,000, so one can readily see what a vast organization the Order is.
