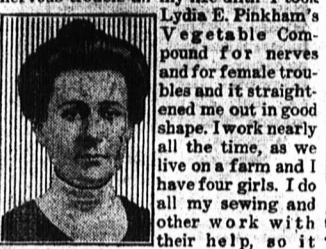

Russians Now near Kut-El-Amara
PETROGRAD, March 19.—via London.—The Russian troops in Persia are now so far advanced toward the Mesopotamian front that they may be said to be in virtual co-operation with the British at Kut-El-Amara, where General Townshend's forces have been besieged for several months, and the campaign against Bagdad has become two-fold, with the likelihood of the Russians being an important factor in the Mesopotamia operations as their allies.
Before the Russian penetration through the mountain passes of the Kermanshah region, it was generally held that the chief aim of the Russian operations on the extreme southern front was, effectively and once for all,

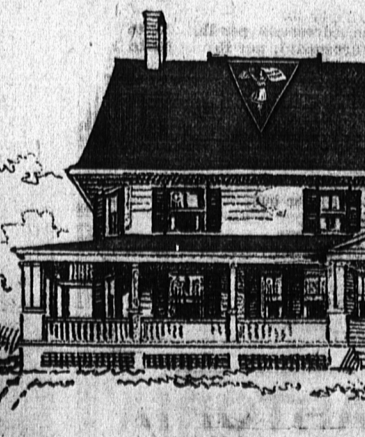

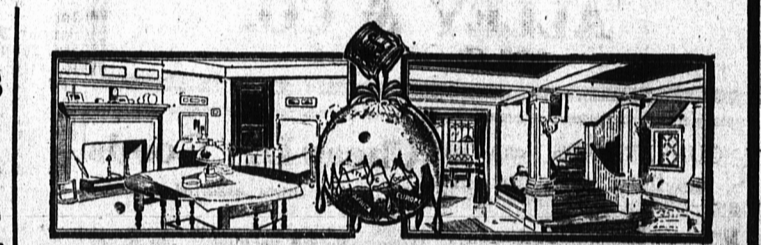
