The Golden-eyes and Scaup have very small gullets and cannot swallow a fish of any size. Their food consists mainly of shrimp and small marine life as well as certain forms of vegetable matter.

Strange as it may seem the Hungarian partridge appeared to take the cold snap in their stride. There was plenty of grit available at all times and weed patches were not drifted over. During one of the coldest afternoons, approximately 7 degrees below zero, I watched a covey of 8 in an uncultivated hayfield busily stripping hayseed off the heads showing above the snow. There wasn't a day during the cold spell that the birds were not able to feed. If they can keep their little tummies (stomachs) well stocked with food they can stand all kinds of cold. Some winters we have blizzards that last for several days. During such periods all species of birds suffer, except our native partridge. Those hardy birds simply dive off a limb into a convenient snow bank where they remain snug and warm, until the weather clears.

There are a lot of storable covers of Hungarian partridge, that are in splendid condition, to be found throughout the province.

On the 14th of this month I had occasion to drive to Flat River. I didn't see any Hungarian partridge until I was nearing Eldon on my way back to Charlottetown. My way of thinking that is a good sign, particularly in January. The birds are wintering well, they are not too much in evidence. When one sees coveys
