RUSSIA FEELING MUCH IRRITATION

Over Diplomatic Failures and Coolness of France Her Fleet may Force the Dardanelles if Leave to Pass is Refused—Japanese Bankers Closing up Business.

JAPS STILL GETTING READY.

PORT ARTHUR, Jan. 18.—(Special)—The Japanese banks are rapidly closing up their business in Manchuria.

RUSSIAN DIPLOMATS IRRITATED. ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 18.—(Special)—Much irritation exists here over the failure of Russian diplomacy in the matter of transferring the negotiations to this capital.

RUSSIA'S DOUBTS AND FEARS. There is also much chagrin at the indifferent attitude of France, and Russia stands in fear of the United States and Great Britain.

RUSSIA'S BLACK SEA FLEET. BERLIN, Jan. 18.—(Special)—The report that Russia has applied to the Porte for permission to take her Black Sea fleet through the Dardanelles is confirmed.

MAY FORCE THE DARDANELLES. The demand will be repeated. Germany's attitude is one of unconcern. The question is one upon which all the great powers have a voice.

PAPAL PLANS FOR THE WEST. ROME, Jan. 18.—(Special)—The Congregation of the Propaganda this morning decided to propose to the Pope the erection of Newfoundland into a new ecclesiastical Province, also to create a new diocese at Joliette, Quebec taking it from the archdiocese of Montreal.

A DESTRUCTIVE WATERSPOUT. BLOOMFONTEIN, Jan. 18.—(Special)—A fearful waterspout here destroyed three hotels and many houses with loss of life. The number of the dead is not yet ascertained. Hundreds of persons are rendered homeless and destitute.

ADVENTURERS REACH SAN FRANCISCO. SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 18.—(Special)—M. McManus and C. Thompson of Halifax reached here after an exciting journey with Patagonian Indians, having abandoned the Nova Scotia party who are searching for gold at the Straits of Terra del Fuego.

SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL.

A special meeting of the City Council was held yesterday afternoon at five o'clock to consider the amendment to the snow by-law and to consider a by-law regarding the inspection of electric wires.

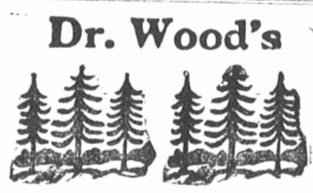
The amendment to the snow by-law was for the purpose of striking out the words providing for the levelling of the snow and clearing out the gutters.

The by-law provides for the appointment of an inspector. His duties shall be to see all instructions of the Mayor and the Council, to be the superintendent of the fire alarm system and other systems owned by the city and to keep in proper order, to have care and maintenance of all wiring on city property, to inspect all electric and metallic wires in the city and report all violations of the law, to cause any company having street lighting to keep lights clean and comply with all other conditions of said lighting, to notify owners of defects in wiring etc. and to shut off the current if defects are not remedied in a reasonable time.

Mayor Warburton spoke of the increase of insurance by Fire Underwriters and quoted a resolution passed at the meeting of Canadian Municipalities to endeavor to devise a remedy in Municipal Insurance. He mentioned the case of the city of London Ont. where the Insurance had been increased after complying with demands of the underwriters as in this city.

Letters were read from R. W. Hogg offering his services as Electric Inspector for one month and saying that he had interviewed a number of the Board of Fire Underwriters and they were agreeable to his appointment.

Meeting adjourned till today at ten for third reading of the by-laws.
