"TRY TO GET IN"

TO KEEP FLOWERS FRESH ALL WINTER

I was told that flowers will keep fresh for a long while if the stalks are put into potatoes, writes a contributor. Here is the method described to me:—Get well-developed buds of roses and other kinds from the garden and push the stalks into good-sized potatoes.

Several go to each potato. The potatoes are arranged on a dish or tray, and the whole covered with a well-made box fitted closely over the flowers, and stored in a cool place. Every few weeks the blossoms should be examined and any traces of mildew wiped away at once.

Flowers treated in this way, I am told, keep in good order for months and if the plan is started in the autumn a winter supply of blossoms is assured. When the flowers are needed you take them out of the potatoes, cut a small bit from each stalk, and then place the stems in a bowl of warm water. By the time the water is cold the buds will have expanded finely.

Promising Prospects of Island Trade

Mr. John Messervy, returned last week from Montreal, Ottawa and Toronto where as usual he interested himself in matters concerning the port in connection with the proposed extension of the railway. He also interestingly mentioned in connection with the matter of the Canadian National Railway. It was during this visit that the management decided to begin the double ferry service on May 3. They both expressed themselves as anxious to give Prince Edward Island the best possible service and promised to give their most careful consideration to any complaints that may be brought to their attention. They are preparing for an unusually large passenger service during the coming summer and are making the necessary arrangements to meet it while recognizing their responsibility in the matter of moving freight as expeditiously as possible to and from the island.

Mr. Hanna was greatly interested in the Montreal, P. E. Island and Newfoundland service and also in the services between P. E. Island and Great Britain, West Indies and South America. He was particularly anxious that this service would prove a success.

At Montreal Mr. Messervy interviewed the manager of the Canadian Mercantile Marine, Mr. R. B. Teakle, who is very friendly to Prince Edward Island and is anxious that the service shall prove a benefit to the shippers and farmers here. All that is needed to make this service a success is to get the merchants and shippers to realize the immense possibilities of extending their trade to these new markets. In this connection Mr. Messervy has prepared a list of dealers whose reliability is vouchsafed for and whom he suggests that P. E. Island shippers and merchants should at once get into communication with. He will furnish this list to any who may communicate with him. They are local merchants in Great Britain, West Indies and South America as well as Newfoundland.

Later on it is possible that a line of small steamers may be procured to carry on a service between Charlottetown and Magdalen Islands and also Cape Breton and New Brunswick ports in the Northumberland Strait as immense quantities of lobster, seals, lumber etc., are available as feeders for ocean traffic.

"Gravest Crisis in Whole Irish History"

LONDON, March 29.—"The gravest crisis in the whole Irish history" is the description applied to the present situation by the Dublin correspondent of the London Times in referring to the country's fast drifting into anarchy. "The Irish public views current events with profound dismay and sickness of heart," he says, "and is amazed and frightened at the Government's failure to recognize the facts of the situation."

their dangers. Knowing that the sympathies of the telegraphers in the state service are largely with the conspirators, they dare not use the wires to transmit official information.

The news columns of the London morning papers are dominated by the Irish trouble; they give the greatest prominence to the murder of Magistrate Bell, while some treat the case of William O'Brien, a Dublin alderman, who is on a hunger strike, as equally serious.

"Criminal Lunacy."

The Daily News denounces the treatment of O'Brien as "criminal lunacy," and referring to Andrew Bonar Law's statement in the House of Commons, imputes to him the same spirit as actuated Magistrate Bell's murder.

The Times also condemns the Government's attitude towards O'Brien as calculated to inflame that body of Irish opinion whereon, it says, the salvation of Ireland must depend.

The Daily Chronicle and Morning Post, on the other hand, defend the treatment of O'Brien. They contend that the Sinn Fein has shown itself to be essentially a murder so-

cety, and as O'Brien is a Sinn Feiner, they argue that he is involved in the murder conspiracy, which neither he nor the other leaders have denounced.

The Post again sharply scores the failure of the Administration to govern Ireland, advocates strong methods, and maintains that the position has now become that Great Britain must either grant Ireland complete independence or reconquer her.
