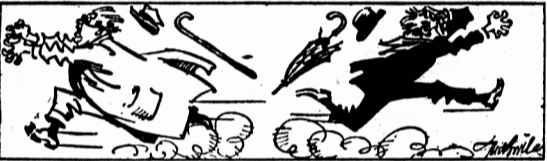

LOST OPPORTUNITY

The favorable opening lead in today's deal should have been all the declarer needed for the fulfillment of his slam contract.

South dealer. North-South vulnerable.

having already made the strong cue-bid of two spades, he leaped from three hearts to six hearts.

West felt that before he lost his control of the club suit he had better establish a trick somewhere, and therefore tried what was practically the "desperation" opening of a low diamond, away from the king. (This was a questionable choice—the neutral trump lead might have been more logical.) Declarer let the lead ride to his own hand and was naturally pleased to win with the queen. It did him little good, however, for when he then drew trumps and led the club jack, West won with the ace and promptly returned a club. South got one discard on dummy's club suit, but he still had to lose a spade.

The right line of play, after the favorable opening, was to draw two rounds of trumps, cash the diamond ace and ruff dummy's last diamond, then to lead the club four toward dummy. Consider: West had bid spades, and probably had a five-card suit, at least. He had shown two hearts. His opening lead was from at least three diamonds. Hence he probably had either two or three clubs. If he had three clubs there was nothing South could do about it unless the ten dropped; but with West actually holding only ace-small in clubs, he would be on the spot. If he put up the club ace on the first lead, South would get two discards; if he ducked, the next club play would put him in with the blank ace and force a return that would let South avoid the loss of a spade.
