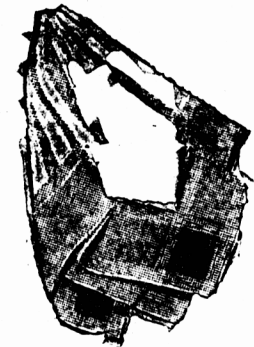

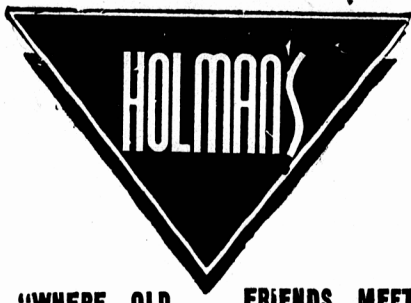

While the teaching staff and the students have used the new school since after the Easter holidays this spring, it has not been officially opened but that enjoyable function is slated for June 17th.—O.

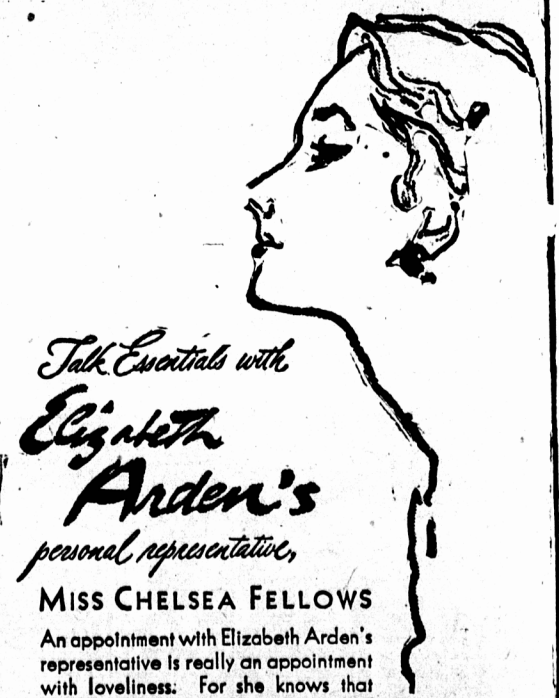
