CURLING SEASON OPENS.—The cold weather has put the ice in the Curling rink in great condition and the first curling of the season will start this afternoon.

ARENA OPENS.—The Arena opened for the season last evening with one of the largest attendances in its history. There was a magnificent sheet of ice and the Veterans Band under the leadership of Bandmaster John McFarlane rendered a splendid musical programme.

BOWLING TOURNAMENT.—An interesting five pin bowling match took place in the Charlottetown Bowling Alley last night, when a team from Carvell Bros. defeated the employees of J. A. Faruhamson & Co. with a lead of 128 pins. Of the three games between these teams all were won by the Carvell outfit. Much interest in being taken in this exhilarating sport and other contests are looked forward to.

YESTERDAY'S MARKET.—The market yesterday was a largely attended one. Some choice samples of Christmas poultry were displayed for which exceptional prices were demanded. Geese in some cases sold as high as \$7 each, but the general range was from \$3 to \$5.50. Ducks sold from \$1.75 to \$2.50 each and fowl from \$1.50 to \$1.75. The dealers prices for poultry ranged from 38c to 41c pound for geese and ducks, 25c to 28c. for fowl and 30 to 35c for chicken. There was a very good meat market, beef retailing from 18c to 35c small and by the quarter 14c to 18c and lamb 20c to 25c lb.

NO SYDNEY HOTEL ON OLD SITE

SYDNEY, December 18.—Because the owners want too much for the property, it is believed that the new Sydney Hotel will not be erected up on the site of the former structure destroyed by fire last spring. George Ross, architect, of Montreal, made this statement at a meeting here of the Board of Trade and others interested in the proposed re-building.
