

'Side Man Escapes In Crossing Crash

Mr. Earle Cannon, manager of the Unemployment Insurance Office, Summerside narrowly escaped death or serious injury about 1:30 last evening when his automobile was struck by a train at the Water Street East railway crossing.

Cannon was proceeding up town and the locomotive, which was shunting, was heading east. The engine was not moving very fast and the tracks were slippery from the rain, which was falling, and probably caused the car to slide away from the front of the locomotive which then proceeded across the crossing. The engine struck about the front door of the car on the driver's side and damaged the vehicle considerably. Mr. Cannon was not injured. He was alone in the car at the time.

During the daytime there is a man on duty at this crossing to stop traffic but after he goes off duty there is no warning system of any kind to advise drivers of an approaching train. Mr. Ernest Deignan was the engineer of the locomotive. —S.

ous trip back to the breaking ship and remained aboard until tonight sending out distress messages confirming the position of the ship and condition of his shipmates.

Returns To Shore

In his last message, received early tonight, he repeated that the men had no shelter from the beating, icy rain and were suffering badly from exposure. Then he coolly informed his listeners he was "going to hop ashore again."

This meant a battle through angry white water and being crashed on a rocky coast which could easily hole the bottom of his small boat.

R.C.A.F. Search and Rescue unit here has picked up a message from the Newfoundland Rangers' station at the Grepfell Mission at St. Anthony, about 10 miles from Pistol Bay. It confirmed the shipwrecked men were definitely on Sacred Island but that rescue attempts by sea with the small craft available would have to wait until the weather moderates.

The message suggested that larger craft be asked to continue attempts to reach the survivors.

Cutters Turn Back

American Coast Guard cutters Evergreen and Duane had already turned back to their Argentina base believing the St. Anthony party would be able to reach the scene.

However, this new information and the fact that it has been suggested a larger ship might be able to effect a rescue from the lee shore of Sacred Island might mean that the two Coast Guard cutters would return to the rescue.

R.C.A.F. Search and Rescue at the Labrador Goose Bay base was told today that the ceiling was too low and visibility so bad that it would be useless and impracticable to attempt to drop supplies to the survivors.

Late this afternoon and soon after the radio operator regained the ship he sent this message: "Master believes ship on northern part of Sacred Island. Conditions bad. Must have help within 48 hours."

At that time it was believed the message had come from the makeshift radio which "Shark" had assembled ashore. But later messages indicated the plucky operator had abandoned the shore radio for his hazardous wireless room aboard the sinking freighter.
