Betless Racing A Failure

NORTH RANDALL, Ohio, Aug. 17.—Walter Cox, of Goshen, N. Y., had a field day here this afternoon, this closing day of the 1927 Grand Circuit meeting, winning the \$3,000 North Randall Stake for 2.11 class trotters with Hazelton, and the \$3,000 Stake 2.17 class trotters with Sam Williams. The final event of the program, the \$4,000 Home Brew, resulted in a straight heat victory for Fine Girl, driven by Vic Fleming, of the North Randall Colony, and owned by Frank Callahan, Tiffin, Ohio.

A BIG FAILURE F. L. Devereaux, Chairman of the Forest City Livestock and Fair Company, which for many years has staged Grand Circuit racing here, issued a statement at the completion of the meeting indicating that the betless racing was a failure. The present meet was staged without betting due to a ruling of Sheriff Edward Hanratty forbidding betting.

Britain Unlikely To Be In Olympics

AMSTERDAM, Holland, Aug. 17.—At a recent conference in Paris, between the executive committee of the International Association of Football Federations and the International Olympic committee it was agreed that an indemnity for lost earnings must be awarded the footballers competing in the Olympic games without losing their amateur status. It was, however, provided that the money must be paid to employers and not direct to players. This decision was discussed at a meeting of the International Amateur Athletic Federation here today, and a resolution was passed regretting it. It was pointed out that according to the rules of the I. A. A. F., any person receiving payment for broken time in any sport is debarred from participation in events under the jurisdiction of the I. A. A. F. Secretary Wall, of the English Football Association, referring to Paris decision, said that in his view Britain could not be represented in any sport at the Amsterdam Olympic games next year. He described the decision as sacrificing the fundamental principle of amateur sport for an expedient, the effect of which would be a revolution in sport. He also pointed out that the Paris decision not only applied to amateur footballers, but all other sports.

(Canadian Press) CONNAUGHT RIFLE RANGES SOUTH MARCH, Aug. 16.—Under unfavorable weather conditions Lieut. J. B. Powers of the Carleton Light Infantry Grand Falls, N. B., today captured the Bankers Match team at the second days shooting in the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, meet here. Lieut. Powers put up a total of 97 closely pressed by Private J. H.
