Some members of the Executive of the Provincial Branch of the Temperance Alliance took advantage of Hon. Mr. Foster's presence in the city to wait on him and ascertain something of his view on the great question of the total prohibition of the traffic in intoxicating liquors. The delegates were very graciously received, the discussion was quite informal, and several phases of the matter were touched upon. Mr. Foster being asked whether in the event of his party being returned to power, he would support a measure to prohibit the importation into and the manufacture of intoxicants in any Province that, as our own had declared for its total suppression for beverage purposes, answered that if it were within the power of the Dominion Parliament to pass such a measure, and he did not see why it was not, it would certainly receive his cordial support. As to the revenue side of the question he did not think that it would stand in the way for a moment; and the more especially as in this case of a Province going so overwhelmingly in favor of prohibition, as our Province had done, the loss of the revenue would be very slight.
