Dalziel, Superintendent of Waterworks and Sewers, and the re-arrangement in the office staff, Mr. J. A. McMillan being appointed manager and Mr. A. W. E. Douse, engineer of waterworks and Sewerage System and Miss Doris Gill, stenographer and office assistant.

The reports states that 551 feet of 6 in. C. I. water main were laid during the year on Euston and Felling Streets and 163 feet of 4 in. main on Euston Street East. To meet the expenditure for this work and to pay off an overdraft in the Bank, debentures for \$6,500.00 were issued at 5 p. c., 6000 of which sold at par.

13 water connections were made to houses during the year. The total number of services now laid is 2599.

At the close of the year there are 2400 dwellings, stores, etc., using water supplied by the Department. 1540 of these are connected with the sewerage system.

The sum of \$32,102.17 was collected in water rates, in 1918, an increase of nearly \$100.00 over the amount received the previous year. After paying all running expenses the commissioners paid the City Council the sum of \$13,711.69. This amount, plus the \$1000.00 provided by the Council leaves \$4,847.00 available for the Waterworks and Sewerage Sinking Fund, besides paying the interest on all the Waterworks and Sewerage Debentures floated. The special Water and Sewerage Tax formerly assessed levied and collected by the City Council was this year abolished and if the earnings continue as they are it may not again be necessary to levy this tax.

The pumping records show 391,995.595 gallons of water pumped in the year, 54,098,000 being from the North River wells. The daily pumping for the year was 1,074,000 gallons or about 90 gallons per head per day.

681 feet of main sewer pipe were laid on Euston, Felling and Granville Streets during the year. 28 buildings were connected with the sewerage system. The total number of build-

Hard Jolt to Pres. Wilson

TORONTO, Jan. 11.—Col. Geo. T. Dennison, police magistrate of Toronto, at a luncheon given at the King Edward Hotel today in honor of Major General G. M. Corey, who is visiting at his home here, blamed President Wilson for the signing of the armistice with Germany, instead of the security of a military victory by the Allies.

"Any trouble we have had," he said, "may be attributed to the premature butting in of this civilian, who gave the Germans the chance that they snapped at to secure armistice terms, when Haig and Foch declared that they had them beaten. Had it not been for this, it would have been a clean, straight knockout blow."

Touching on the Bolshevik movement, Col. Dennison said: "All this would have been avoided if our friend in the United States had just declined to use his typewriter for a short time."

Synopsis of Canadian North Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must be a Canadian citizen or a person of European descent, or a person of any other race who may be made a Canadian citizen. Lands agent may be made a Canadian citizen on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years, or homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, or certain conditions. A habitable house is required in each of three years, or residence is performed in a vicinity.

In certain districts a homestead in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side by homestead. Price \$100 per acre.

Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres of cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect house worth \$500.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

CITY SURVEYOR'S REPORT

The report of the City Surveyor, Mr. J. P. Nicholson shows that the sum of \$10,055.15 has been the amount expended on ordinary street maintenance, \$5,894.33 for labor and \$4,160.82 for material. For permanent works the expenditure for the year was \$3,736.90 the sum of \$1,578.70 for labor and \$2,157.30 for material in miscellaneous work for labor there was expended among other things the following: Victoria Park \$400.47; City Squares \$171.44; Market house \$21.90; City Hall, \$67.25; City Scale house \$32.00. Celebrating for G. V., \$93.33. The total expenditure for labor and material in the whole work outlined in the report was \$14,850.10. Wooden sidewalks during the year cost \$1,224.00; for hard stone for the streets the sum of \$1,201.52 was spent and for opening gutters \$1,083.15.

POLICE COURT REPORT

The report of the Police Court Clerk, Mr. John McLaughlin shows that during the past year 259 cases have been tried and adjudicated upon, a decrease of 63 on last year.

The sum of \$1,164 was collected in ordinary fines; \$1,320 in prohibition fines; \$521.14 in costs; \$65.25 in poll tax; \$570 in dog tax, a total of \$3,640.39.

During the year there were a total of 42 prohibition cases tried, 21 of these resulted in conviction and 21 in dismissal. During 1917 the total was 70-34 convictions and 36 dismissals.

The number of cases of drunkenness in 1918 was 88—83 convictions and five dismissals as against a total of 168 in 1917—137 convictions and 31 dismissals.

Other cases of the past year were: Disorderly conduct on Street 19; Insulting and abusive language 8; Non-payment of dog-tax 5; Keeping a disorderly house 4; Keeping a malicious dog 5; Annoying people in their dwellings 6;
