

## SAYS SOCIALIST LEADER IS HELD UP AT DOVER AUTHORITY OF GOVT

LONDON July 26.—Morris Hillquit, the United States Socialist party leader, who arrived at Dover from France Wednesday, was refused permission to land by an immigration officer, who said he was acting on instructions from secretary for home affairs, according to the Daily Herald, the Labor organ, today.  
Mr. Hillquit adds the Herald, eventually was permitted to spend the night in Dover, but was instructed to report at noon today. Unless the instructions are cancelled by that time, the newspaper declares, he must return to France.  
Mr. Hillquit's passport was visited by the British authorities in the United States the Herald states.
