TORPEDO BOATS TO ATTACK FLEET.

QUEBEC, July 28.—The torpedo attack on the fleet which was to have taken place Saturday, has been set for tonight, either before or immediately after the fireworks display from the warships. It is not naturally a part of the tercentenary program, nor are the authorities at all communicative about the details, but it will be nevertheless one of the most interesting of the warship events which the presence of the warships has made possible. All that is known at present is that three or four of the latest launches of the Exmouth whose slate grey color makes them difficult to detect at even a short distance on a foggy day, will be sent both down and up the river early in the afternoon. When it grows dark enough, from one or both directions they will steam at full speed toward the fleet, endeavouring to get within point blank torpedoing distance of one another of the gigantic warship before being "picked up" by the searching lights. From such a vantage ground as Dufferin Terrace hunting for the launches by combination search lights of the fleet should make the scene one such as has never before been witnessed in Canada.

POISON POURED DOWN HIS THROAT

INGERSOLL, Ont., July 28.—A peculiar poisoning case, which nearly resulted fatally is reported from Colden's Corners. While putting Paris green on potatoes with a hand sprayer, on Saturday afternoon, Bert Butterworth, a young man employed by Mr. Bradshaw, accidentally swallowed a quantity of the deadly mixture. The accident happened when Butterworth inserted a nail in the hose of the sprayer, which had become clogged. Forced by a heavy pressure, the liquid, suddenly freed was driven into the young man's face as soon as the nail was inserted. He was not aware at the time that he had swallowed any of the mixture, but half an hour after he became violently ill, and an Ingersoll physician was summoned. Butterworth was in a very serious condition, and his life was only saved through the use of prompt remedies. It was then discovered that he had swallowed a large quantity of the poison, which had evidently been driven down his throat by the force of the sprayer.

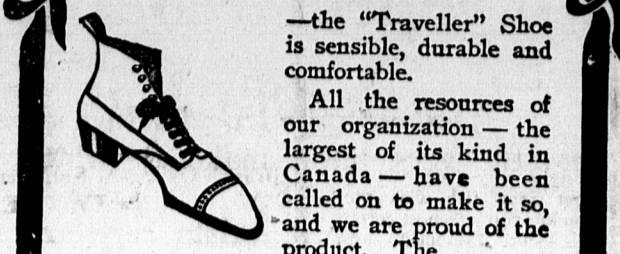
