We have passed the longest day, with its 15 hours 28 minutes of sunshine, and already the day has shortened and the night lengthened by a minute. In fact we are now again within six months of the shortest day of the year.

What mysterious connection there is between the color of the hair and a right mental balance remains to be explained, but it seems to be an indisputable fact that fair-haired persons are much less liable to insanity than those whose hair is dark. With intermediate shades there is less difference, but as between distinctly light and distinctly dark hair the number of insane is said to be fully four of the dark to one of the light.

Nelson, B. C. has a public library to which the City Council contributes \$500 a year. During the past 12 months the library was visited by 23,303 persons, an average of 1,917 per month. In the winter season the attendance is much larger than in summer. In January last the number of patrons was nearly 3,000. The expense of rent and management was \$70 per month, and the total expenditure was \$1,233. Nelson appears to be much more progressive in library matters than one of the cities by the sea.

The Patriot tells that Hon. D. Farquharson was yesterday waited upon by a delegation and presented with a requisition asking him to become a candidate for the Commons in West Queens when Sir Louis Davies' retirement is definitely announced. The Patriot adds that the Premier stated in reply that he would accept the nomination if offered to him. On the street there is talk that the movement is a strategic one, intended to hold the nomination open until Mr. Farquharson's return from the Pacific coast when it can be dealt with according to the circumstances then existing.

**PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND**

And Its Attractions To Tourists.

Prince Edward Island's summer climate is delightful, and scenery is beautiful and quietly picturesque. Surrounded by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, it enjoys all the coolness of the sea breeze and the advantages that can only be derived from sea bathing at about 65 degrees.

Charlottetown has over 12,000 inhabitants, and is the capital. It has many great retail stores, besides a large wholesale trade. It has a Gas Light and Power Company two Electric light plants, and a street railway is in embryo. It has a first class water works and sewerage system. It is famed for its many pleasant drives the principal of which is the new Park Boulevard, its attractive surroundings, pure water and clear cool and bracing air. It is widely known as one of the healthiest cities in Canada. It has two hospitals, many churches and a large and elegant new Opera House. It also has several fine public buildings and a market which is one of the chief resorts of the citizens here. It has one of the largest and best equipped pork-packing establishments in the Dominion. On the west side in the Park; on the east side are the magnificent new Exhibition Building and Driving Park. Chief among its public squares are Queen Square in the centre of the city, beautifully laid out with blooming plants of every description, a fountain and well arranged walks, and enlivened with a band of music during the summer evenings. The rural scenery in the vicinity of Charlottetown is charming, and horses for driving are abundant at very low prices. Boats can also be hired, and steamers run regularly on the bays and rivers, affording most pleasant excursions. The principal hotels are Davies, Queen, and Bevere.

Summerside has above 3000 inhabitants. It is situated on beautiful Bedeque Bay. It has the largest and finest departmental store in the Maritime Provinces, besides having other large retail stores. It has an Electric Light Plant, and a water works system and sewerage are being agitated for. The hotels are—Clifton, Queen, Bass, Stratheona and Campbell. Georgetown and Souris have a population of about 1,000 each. In the former are the Aitken and Tapper hotels and in Souris the Sea View.

At Cape Traverse a very pleasant summer resort, is the Landsdown Hotel; in Alberton, the Albion Terrace and Wisner, in Tignish the Railway and Bellevue; in Kensington, Clark's and Commercial; in Montague, McDonald, and in Mount Stewart, Clark's and Manson's.

In addition to those already mentioned there are other towns and villages in the Province with hotel accommodations, while many farm houses prepare for the reception of tourists. The rivers and streams teem with trout, the bays with mackerel, while game of every description abounds.
