**Dominions' Status Hangs Like Cloud Over Conference**

LONDON, Oct. 9.—The Nation, Liberal weekly review, declares that the question of the national status of the Dominions hangs like a thundercloud over the coming Imperial Conference and that Premier Mackenzie King is not likely to come to London without having something to say about the recent "constitutional crisis" at Ottawa.

With reference to Premier James Barry Hertzog, of South Africa, the Nation says that for some weeks he has been stretching the definition of national status to mean complete sovereign independence, thus satisfying the extreme nationalists of South Africa, then by way of conciliating the English-speaking and moderate Dutch residents of South Africa he explains his pronouncement otherwise.

Premier Stanley M. Bruce of Australia, the Nation continues, opposes Premier Hertzog's definition of dominion status. Premier Bruce also is strongly opposed to ambassadorial representation of the dominions, according to the Nation, and is providing with his own plan for consolidating the Imperial foreign defense policy.

The Nation thinks there is plenty of inflammable material in the question of the powers of the dominions.

The Spectator, Conservative weekly, likewise notes Premier Hertzog's alleged inclination lately to unsay, rather than emphasize, the doctrines advocated by him not long ago. It is supposed, the Spectator says, that Premier Hertzog's consent to have a referendum on the question of a new national flag for South Africa which would not contain the Union Jack means that he is ready to abandon the project.
