## CHURCHILL'S GIFTS BY AN ADMIRER

The Qualities That Have Been Of Great Value To Him,

LONDON, May 19—An admirer of Winston Churchill says that he is the possessor of many of the qualifications for success. He is sympathetic; he has a heart, and he has imagination. He is sometimes spoken of, and not only by "the other side," as if he were merely a cynically clever young man, brimful of ambition and high spirits, but indifferent as to which side he champions and what weapons he uses in the fight. It is easy to quote from him, as from his father, sayings, the superficial cut-and-thrust rhetoric of party debate, that give plausibility to this view of his character. But this is not the truth about his mind and temperament. He has an acute, searching mind, and he quickly sees both sides of an argument. And on the other hand, he is fond of rhetoric, and like all rhetoricians, is now and then taken in by his own eloquence.

These two characteristics sometimes give the impression that he does not care, an impression that all brilliant impulsive talkers and thinkers create among those who listen without discernment. But it is far from being the truth. His knowledge is not wide, his life, exciting and full of change and color, has been lived too much in the exterior of the Empire and too little as its centre. He has been a soldier, a traveller, a journalist, a writer, crowding into his days, as well as have been, impressions that fall to few men or women in a long lifetime. This discursiveness of outlook necessarily affects his intellect. He has always possessed definite opinions, which were democratic and spring from an open nature and a generous disposition.

### A TRUE DEMOCRAT.

For these reasons he should do well as Minister of Commerce. He is practical, and though he sometimes fails in tact, he learns from experience and is far less self-confident than he seems. He is a born politician. His life is in politics. He talks politics. His mind never goes to sleep; it receives fresh impressions from small happenings as well as from great. And he is a thorough democrat. He has no conception of a political action apart from the mass of the people, their movements, their wants, their hopes and passions. In this respect he is the precise opposite of Mr. Balfour, whose personality is aristocratic, and concerns itself with the preservation of those interests, social and intellectual, which are bound up with the government of the many by the few.

Lack of intellect, though plastic, has its cautious side, and it has probably been an advantage to him that like Mr. Gladstone he has spent his early years in the Tory camp, and learned both the strength and the weakness of the case for things as they are. Withal, he is a born fighter. He knows the value of combativeness when to meet an attack with a counter-attack. This is the secret of all successful warfare or peace, but it is one which the commonplace and the unenterprising never learn.

## FRENCH DUEL. MAY PROVE FATAL

Left-Handed Novice Pinks Well Known Duelist, and Condition Serious

PARIS, May 19—The rare incident of a serious French duel, occurred yesterday, when a youthful lefthanded swordsman, of the name of Ravenez, pinked his opponent named Vilette, dangerously in the lung. They quarrelled some time ago, but Vilette, who is one of the most experienced swordsmen in Paris, and who has fought 15 duels, refused to fight until Ravenez attained his majority. This happened a few days ago and the duel was arranged. The novice who was the pupil of the famous Sabreur Kvikhoffeer proved to be markedly superior to his opponent. His blade pierced Vilette's lung several inches. The latter was taken to a hospital vomiting blood. His recovery is doubtful. The combatants are highly connected.

## TWO LIVES LOST IN \$300,000 FIRE

Much Damage Done at Saul Ste Marie In Recent Fire.

SALT STE MARIE, May 19—Fire which is supposed to have started from an spark from a dynamo in the power house of the Lake Superior Power Company here at 4 o'clock this morning destroyed the Pigeons water and light powerhouse, the Lake Superior Company's power plant and the Soo pulp and paper mills storeroom. The estimated loss is about \$300,000, fully covered by insurance.

Two men, A. E. Welsh, dynamo tender, and E. Grey, assistant, lost their lives in the fire. Neither of the bodies have been found.
