Stock Markets At A Glance

NEW YORK, Feb. 5 - (AP) - The Stock Market today made its five rising sessions in a row with buyers concentrating on motors and other peace-trade industrials while more or less ignoring armament connected issues.

The Associated Press Y-P-Stock composite was up 2 of a point at 59.7 where it was only 2 under its 7-year peak of early January.

TORONTO, Feb. 5 - (CP) - Heavy turnover on rising prices gave a bullish tinge to the operations on the Toronto Exchange today, trading rured in the gold cents but wider general gains were recorded for the Base Metals and the western oils, all groups were up in the index at the close.

CHICAGO, Feb. 5 - (AP) - Grain futures markets were firm to strong today with wheat and rye leading the uptick and at times gaining a cent. Offerings were light except on the bushel, shorts covered and commission houses and professional traders were on the buying side.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 5 - (CP) - Rye continued to advance today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with all futures posting new seasonal highs. May hit \$1.25, July 1.25. Cash prices oats: 2 feed 60; 3 feed 48; other grades at ceiling prices. Barley: All grades at ceiling prices 64 1/2.

MONTREAL, Feb. 5 - (CP) - Leading securities continued to show moderate strength in trading today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market in extension of a slight upward move in evidence on average in spots in the lists board Friday and Saturday. Papers, banks and goods were higher in the indices and industrials were better. Utilities were marked down. Individual winners totalled 59 and losers 30, while 45 stocks were stationary.

Livestock

MONTREAL, Feb. 5 - (CP) - Cattle and hogs were firm to 20 cents higher and other classes steady in trading today on the Livestock Markets.

After a slow start trading in the cattle section became brisker. Good quality cattle were in demand and steers were 12.25-12.50; heifers were 10-10.50, a few tops ranging at 11. Good cows made 8.50-9 with an odd top at 9.50. Good bulls ranged from 8-9, one being weighed in at 9.25. Commoner kinds were 7. Veal calves, tops were 16 and others 10.15-10. Good weaners 15-15.50 with the bulk of the in-between at 13-14.50. Crossers sold for 7-9.25 mostly 8.50-8.75.

Offerings in lambs were mostly bucks and they went at 11-11.50 with one sale at 12 flat. Prices for sheep were 3-7 according to quality. Hogs brought 18-19.25 for grade A and sows 13.50-14.
