WHITLA CHILD UNLUCKY FOR "BLACK HAND" MEN

BOSTON, Oct. 17.—There was an echo of the famous Whitla kidnapping case of Shanon (Pa), in the United States district court today, when Ernest H. Martin, of Dorchester (Mass), was convicted of sending a "Black Hand" letter to James P. Whitla, threatening to kidnap his son for a second time unless \$10,000 was paid to another man in this City.

According to the evidence the Black Hand letter was mailed in Dorchester, the postal district in which Martin resides. He admitted on the stand that he sent a friend named John W. Wright to get the decoy letter which Mr. Whitla sent to the address given in the Black Hand letter and Martin was arrested while waiting for Wright to get the letter. He denied all knowledge of the Black Hand letter.

NOT ENOUGH MONEY TO CROSS THE BORDER

ST JOHN, Oct. 17.—James Sanford, John Callaghan, John Maher, Robert Semple, M. Maher and two other men, who arrived from Prince Edward Island en route to the United States in search of employment, were stopped here last week by U. S. Immigration Officer Miller on the ground that they were not provided with the amount of money necessary to enable them to cross the border. They spent a day in the city and returned to P. E. Island. When stopped at the depot the men pleaded hard to be allowed to proceed, but Mr. Miller's definite instructions on cases of this nature left him no alternative and they had to go back. The men had been working on the island, but work being slack had decided to strike out for new pastures.

WHYTE SCORES YELLOW PRESS

LONDON, October 17.—At the annual conference of the Institute of Metals at Manchester yesterday, Sir William Whyte, president, made a vigorous attack on the sensational press. He had recently returned from Canada, he said, and he had found there, as in other parts of the world, that false doctrines which were set forth in certain halfpenny papers in this country were accepted as partially true, as if the Old Country were played out. That was all ridiculous nonsense. It might sell papers, but the men who did it for personal advantages were not faithful citizens, and such unfounded statements were most injurious.

PITTSBURG WINS DECIDING GAME

DETROIT, Mich., Oct. 17.—Pittsburg won the world's baseball championship at Bennett Park today by defeating Detroit by the overwhelming score of 8 to 0, in the seventh and decisive game of one of the greatest battles ever fought for the world's title. This gives the National team championship the victory of 4 games to 3. This is the third successive defeat of the American League champions in the world's series and consequently the third straight victory for the National League, the Chicago team having defeated Detroit in 1907 and 1908. The telegram received by the Guardian yesterday morning was incorrect transposing the name of the winner for that of the loser.

GET MONEY AFTER A LONG FIGHT

OTTAWA, October 17.—The Dominion government, after long negotiations through the British foreign office with the government of San Domingo, is one of the periodical revolutions made for damages received by the Nova Scotia schooner Britannia, during one of the periodical revolutions in the island. The schooner was damaged by the fire of Dominican troops on land and the claim for compensation was taken up by the government here. A check for \$1,044 has now been received from San Domingo and the schooner, E.A. O'Brien & Co., of has been forwarded to the owners of Noel.

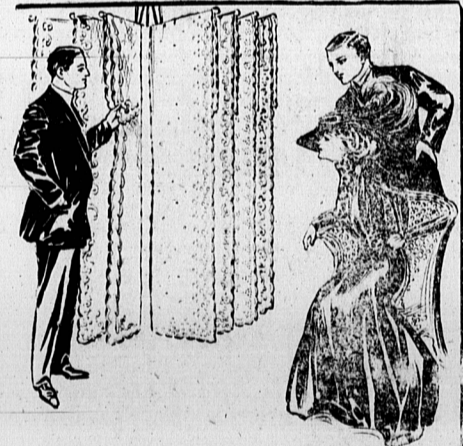
