AMPLE FEED

The general promise of feed grain crops in Canada assures supplies sufficient to meet all domestic requirements and provide for some export shipments during the crop year 1944-5, states the Canadian Coarse Grain Quarterly Review. A feature of the 1944 outlook is the much more favourable crop prospects in Ontario and Quebec. This will make these two provinces dependent on food grain supplies from the Prairie Provinces to the twelve months that lie ahead.

Reserve stocks built up from the big 1943 harvest have largely disappeared as the result of heavy feeding at home during the past two years and liberal exports of oats, barley, and wheat to the United States, but the weather in 1944 has been reasonably good and the very promising start of the 1944 season later have way to more favourable prospects.

Not only is the indicated supply of grains adequate for the new season now setting under way, but a more favourable situation prevails with respect to supplies of high proteins. The Feeds Administrator has warned that this improvement in supplies of high proteins should not be the signal for extravagant or wasteful practices, pointing out that under war-time conditions surpluses can without warning very quickly disappear. He has further indicated that supplies in the coming year may be channelled more to the field of dairy production with less emphasis now being placed on further extension of the poultry industry, which has in the past enjoyed a big share of these high protein supplies.

Big Seizure Of Fake Gas Coupons

MONTREAL, Sept. 4 — (CP) — Royal Canadian Mounted Police officials said here today that counterfeit gasoline rationing coupons seized in the district during the last six weeks, had they been accepted, would have been good for 7,000,000 gallons.

Inspector C. W. Harverson R. C. M. P. acting officer commanding here, said after four men were arrested and two printing presses and counter-fitted gas rationing coupons with a potential value of 800,000 gallons seized during two week-end raids, that severe sentences were in store for all persons convicted as "gasoline saboteurs."

Dutch Gov't May Be Home Within Week

LONDON, Sept. 5 — (CP) — Reuter's diplomatic correspondent wrote today that if the present rate of Allied progress is maintained, the Netherlands Government, established in London since 1940, will be on home soil within a week.

The correspondent said Queen Wilhelmina would follow the Government almost immediately. One of the first acts of the Government after its return will be to order a new census on the basis of which a new voters' register will be prepared. The old registers have been largely destroyed by the Germans and a new parliament cannot be elected until the new register has been completed.

The mandate of the last Netherlands parliament, elected for four years in 1937 has expired. Pending a general election a year or more hence, a new parliament will be appointed as soon as possible by nomination either by the Queen or by the government of representative persons recommended by the resistance leaders.
