PROF. ROBERTSON'S TALK IN Y.M.C.A. HALL

An Entertaining and Instructive Discourse that was Closely Listened to Throughout.

A fair audience assembled in the Y. M. C. A. hall last night to hear Professor Robertson and his associate Dr. Fletcher who are so well known to Guardian readers throughout the Province.

Shortly after 8, His Worship Mayor Warburton took the chair and explained in a brief and happy sentence how unnecessary it was to introduce Professor Robertson.

The Professor stated in his own manly way that it was his highest ambition to be a teacher.

"To me education simply stands for various sorts of power." "A building is not at all a necessary part of a school; a school consists of a teacher and one or more pupils." "You do not invest enough money in your teachers in this Province. The teacher is an interpreter explaining the what, how and why of things." "The work that is most needed is to help the common place boy and girl to live their lives for the largest usefulness to their fellows; the strong students have been forced to the neglect of the others, and much energy has been spent to little advantage by following methods at present in vogue."

The Professor made a plea for an interesting treatment of the subject of Agriculture in our schools. He was pleased to notice an improvement in the treatment of the soil since he first visited the Province twelve years ago and spoke of the enormous importance of thorough training and attention to details.

Spoke of the satisfaction he felt at New Perth when he could show how all his "wild dreams" of twelve years ago are far more than realized; and prophesied deliberately that in another twelve years the Islanders will receive as much money for poultry as we now do for cheese; more than that, it will not seem as strange then for carriages to collect the children just as they now collect the milk cans. "When farming is the main occupation you will find that the people take on the character of the animals they work among." He went on to say that he was disappointed to find so many worthless cows still boarding on the farmers instead of working for them. Farmers are becoming more slovenly than they were a generation or two ago. He urged the importance of finishing his work, using his recent visit to the great Derby races as an illustration school.

"Ignorance amongst the common people is a most costly menace to any state." He spoke of the importance of teaching men to do rather than criticize, to be self-possessed is to be ready to live, it is the things one has done that build

up character. Nature study is no fad, it is not effeminate, it is not primarily to make money but to make men. Throughout this Province the school-houses stand out in ghastly bareness; and one object of having a school garden is to have best object lessons taught by teachers who know their work.

There is money ready, to bear the expenses for three years in one consolidated school and a number of separate schools throughout the Island. By these means the expectation we hope to help Islanders to make the most of all the members of our schools rather than of a few notable students as we now have.

Dr. Fletcher followed in an interesting address a report of which will appear hereafter.
