"SMOKY" FILMED IN TECHNICOLOR, STARRING FRED MACMURRAY

Filmed in thrilling Technicolor and starring Fred MacMurray with Anne Baxter and Burl Ives, "Smoky," the 20th Century-Fox film version of Will James' beloved classic opens today at the Prince Edward Theatre.

James, who was a cowhand himself, wrote the thrilling tale from out of the rough-and-tumble West of cattle stampedes and gun-toting buckaroos he had known all his life. First printed in 1926, the book that tells a story of the West of today in the spirit of the West of old has been published in 32 separate editions.

In the film, MacMurray is seen as Clint Barkley, the hard-hitting, danger-loving cowpuncher. Anne Baxter appears as the trim, romantic-minded ranch boss, while Burl Ives, the famous American ballad singer, plays the "puncher" who weaves his spell about desert camps.

### Veterans In Training Follow Many Pursuits

Of the 145 war veterans who are taking courses at Prince of Wales and St. Dunstan's Colleges, thirty-three have announced their intention to become physicians or surgeons, 13 are studying for dentistry, 26 for various types of engineering, 17 for the teaching profession, B.A., B.Sc. The legal profession accounts for 7 of the remainder and 7 more have decided to become clergymen. 180 Island veterans are taking their university training in other parts of Canada.

Island veterans have also shown interest in the purchasing of farms, equipment for commercial fishing and small holdings. Some 1277 applications have been received by the Island branch of the V.I.A. to date. At present 539 veterans have qualified for full time farming, 233 for small holdings and 112 for commercial fishing. The balance are withdrawals, cancellations or are pending.

### WINGS OF TOMORROW: The Story of Aviation No. 10: Planes for Everyone

(1) Light personal planes may be purchased over the counters of New York department stores today, a fact which indicates the widespread popularity flying will enjoy in the immediate future. Half a dozen manufacturers are building 30 to 50 planes daily to fill the demand, which is expected to reach 500,000 within five years. During the next decade roadable planes will be perfected. Fitted with rotors, they'll replace present-day convertibles. Experts predict that a million such craft will crowd the airways within the next score of years.

(2) Roof-top landing facilities for the "pin-wheels" craft may soon be as common as today's parking lots. Cities will become de-centralized as new suburbs are built around beautifully landscaped air-parks where all residents (by and the family garage contains the new type convertible. Approximately a third of the traffic today crowding the nation's freeways will take to the air. Cities which have waterfronts will pioneer this new era by establishing downtown landing mats now being planned.

(3) Playing an important role in the transition to the air is the present-day helicopter. Large cities now using helicopters to carry mail to outlying airports will find them useful as ambulances and as fire-fighters. De luxe helicopter taxis will rush the time-conscious business executive to widely scattered suburbs of crowded cities.

(4) In the more distant future, atomic power will also be applied to personal aircraft. Like the legendary magic carpet, the atom-powered plane will combine the high speed of the rocket with the conveniences of the helicopter. A trip to the Panama Canal or Alaska from Ohio will be merely an afternoon cruise. Families who like to travel may circle the globe on a week-end, pausing at the press of a button to hover over points of interest.
