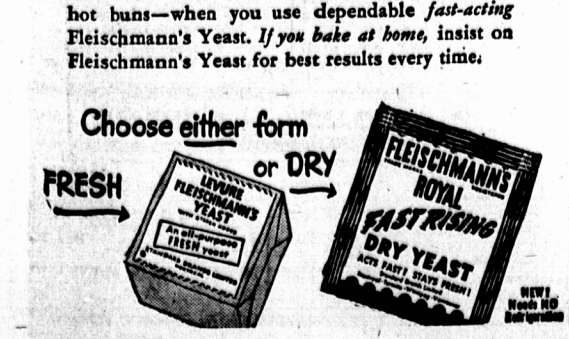

Storage Rot Danger Stressed

Danger of storage rot in potatoes will possibly be greater this year because of much of the 1948 crop breaking down into soft rot in farmers' cellars and storages.

Every storage is liable to certain disease organisms or germs, as some people call them. Many of these are rot producing organisms, which get into the storage through the soil or through the means of various rats which develop in the tubers throughout the storage period.

Every storage bin and cellar should be thoroughly cleaned and the windows left open to allow it to dry out completely. It should then be sprayed with a solution containing two lbs. of bluestone in ten gals. of water.

Mr. Peppin emphasizes that it is the bluestone which does the work of killing the rot organisms. Spray the floors and ceilings thoroughly. An ounce of prevention with this disinfectant may save many pounds of potatoes in storage later on.

Civil Marriage Question Held Over By Synod

HALIFAX, Sept. 13—(CP) — The Church of England in Canada today heard one of its committees report that provisions for civil marriages in Canada "would, on the whole, be desirable."

Later the church's general synod defeated a motion which would have asked the Provincial Governments concerned to pass permissive legislation. This automatically throws out the subject until at least the next General Synod.

Canon W. W. Judd of (605 Jarvis St.) Toronto, in the report of the Council for Social Service, said the issue had been studied for a year by the Church's committee on marriage and divorce. This was the case for civil marriages:

"1. Provision for civil marriage would, on the whole, be desirable."

"2. The church should not do anything to oppose it."

"3. Provision for civil marriage would, on the whole, be desirable."

Civil marriages are those performed by a public servant or marriage commissioner. Such marriages now are performed in some parts of Western Canada.

Canon Judd said the commission's report formed the basis for a decision by the C. S. executive committee. This measure read:

"That in view of new conditions of late years, such as the increase in divorces in Canada and consequent requests for remarriage; the increase of population unattached or lightly attached — to the Church; and the presence in Canada of persons other than the Christian and Jewish faiths.

"And in view of the embarrassing position in which our clergy is frequently placed in relation to such persons requesting marriage and in relation to the ministers of other Christian communions;

"This executive committee... again expresses the opinion that provision for civil marriage should be sought and again urges the Bishops and/or the councils of provincial synods within civil provinces wherein such provisions do not exist, to join with other christian bodies in seeking such provisions through the proper legislative bodies."
