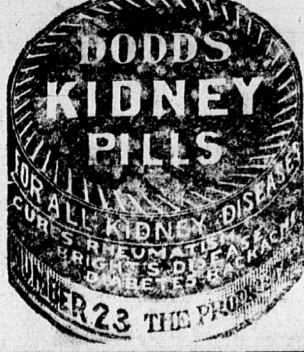

The tribesmen held positions six miles outside of Fez. They were shelled by the artillery and it is estimated that six hundred of them were killed. The situation in Fez has greatly improved.

WHYTEVILLE, Va., June 2.—After deliberating two hours and a half the jury today found Clauo Swanson Allen guilty of murder in the second degree for the killing of Lester Thornton L. Maasie at Hillsville, in March. The jury recommended his punishment to be fixed at fifteen years in the penitentiary.
