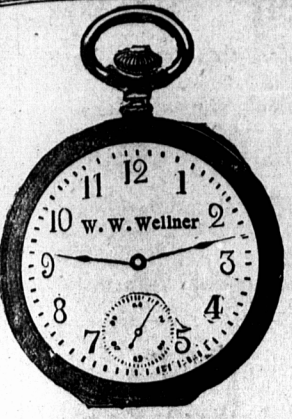

Sir William Blackstone, the learned English commentator on laws, was a printer by trade, King George the III was a printer and not infrequently worked at the trade after he ascended the throne of England. We need not say that Franklin was a printer for this is well known by all who are familiar with his name. Alexander Campbell the theologian is a printer.

Plans and specifications for enlargement and improvements upon the Sydney Mines Y. M. C. A. building are now complete, and contractors are figuring upon the job. The building will be raised and excavations made, so as to give a basement 16 ft. in height. On this ground floor, the gymnasium room will be provided for, with shower and stationary baths, closets and lockers. The general secretary's office will be also upon this floor. The second floor will contain reading and recreation rooms, parlors, and correspondence rooms, while the upper flat will in time be fitted up for tenements. When the work is completed, Sydney Mines will have an Association building which will rank with the best in the province.

At a meeting at Ballantine's Cove, Antigonish County, on November 30th, George Patterson, M. P. for the County of Pictou, made use of a letter from the Minister of Marine & Fisheries, dated at Ottawa, November 3rd, in which the Minister said that he well recalled the arguments addressed to his Department by the late member for Antigonish Co., in favor of a winter route between P. E. Island and the mainland via Cape George, and Georgetown or Souris—that on a recent visit to the Island he had inquired respecting the matter and thought it very likely that the member for Antigonish would succeed in satisfying the Government that the route via Cape George was the most advantageous. That the matter would be carefully examined by Officers of the Department, and that a trial trip would be made to test the merits of the route as soon as the new boat was completed. This is a matter of much importance to the town of Pictou, indeed to the whole County and being that, Mr. Patterson was in possession of that letter and sufficiently well informed to enlighten the electors of Antigonish County, it would be well for the electors of this County, and they would be within their rights to ask their representative for further information on this matter.—Pictou Standard.

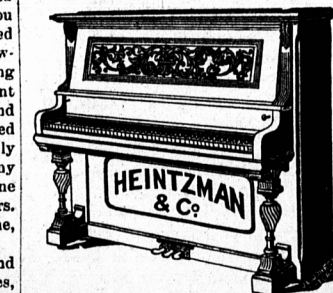
