JOSEPH AND HIS BROTHERS.  
Gen. 45: 1-15. Memory verses, 4-7.

GOLDEN TEXT.  
Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.—Rom. 12, 21.

1. A Loving Brother, v. 1-8.  
2. An affectionate son, v. 9-11.  
Time.—According to Usher's chronology B. C. 1700.

## LESSON HELPS.

1, 2 "Then Joseph could not refrain himself"—The brothers were now in a right frame of mind, and the heart of Joseph was full to overflowing. He exchanges the gravity of a judge for the affection of a brother. "Cause every man to go out"—Every one except his brothers. Reason for (1) he would not have the servants witness his emotion, and (2) he would not have them know of the cruelty which his brothers had shown him years before. It is well to shrink from showing grief before a crowd of curious spectators. "Wept aloud"—Oriental nations are more demonstrative in their grief than Western nations.

3. "I am Joseph"—This was doubtless uttered abruptly. As the name of Joseph was now uttered for the first time in the interview it must have come with startling effect. "Doth my father yet live"—How quickly this question follows, and what affection does it show. "And his reason which is given in the verse.

4, 5. "Come near to me, I pray you"—In the first impulse of terror they had drawn back from him, for they feared his vengeance. "Be not grieved, nor angry with yourselves"—The manner of Joseph was charged from severity to kindness. He was at first severe, to make his brothers humble, and when they were so then he spoke tenderly. Like one greater than he who came after him, he "would not break the bruised reed," lest they would be filled with despair, he encouraged them. "For God did send me before you preserve life"—That is by revealing the coming famine and preparing for it. Four times this thought is repeated. Consider, (1) God looks ahead and orders things to come out aright; (2) God overrules the wrath of man, for the anger of Joseph's brethren led to his elevation in Egypt, and (3) Joseph set a good example to us all in saying, It was God that sent me hither. To him be all the glory.

6. "There shall neither be earing"—Earing is an old English word for ploughing. This seems to show that the famine was caused by the failure of the river Nile to overflow its banks.

7. "And God sent me"—This is the feeling in every pious breast. We are to go because we are sent. To every man there is a mission, great or small, and he is to find out what it is, and then go ahead and do it. Joseph was sent to Egypt for a twofold purpose: (1) "to preserve you a posterity in the earth," else the chosen family would have perished, and the promise would have failed, and (2) "to save your lives by a great deliverance." It was great, it came in a strange way, and it was unexpected.

8. "Not you that sent me hither"

11. "Will I nourish thee"—Joseph was a good son, as this shows, and was willing to care for one who had cared for him when he was a child. Gratitude is due to a kin
