**S. S. SWANSEA TRADER.**—The S. S. Swansea Trader, of the Furness Line, sails from Halifax at 7 o'clock this morning for Charlottetown. She will arrive here Wednesday and after discharging her cargo will leave on return to Halifax, calling at shore points.

**CASCAPEDIA.**—The S. S. Cascapedia, of the Quebec S. S. Line, arrived in Charlottetown last evening with a large cargo from Montreal. She leaves today for Pictou and will return here Thursday, leaving on return to Montreal Thursday night.

**AT RICHIBUCTO, N. B.**—Schooner Dwina, Capt. Fraser, arrived yesterday from Charlottetown, and is loading for that Port at the Swedish Canadian Lumber Company's wharf. Schrs. Maude Weston, Capt. Weston, Maple Leaf, Capt. Fraser, sailed yesterday for Summerside and Charlottetown respectively.

**LUMBER FOR P.E. ISLAND.**—The schooner Dwina, of Richibucto, Capt. Fraser, arrived here from Newcastle, N.B., last week, with what is credited to be the largest cargo of lumber that has been carried by a vessel of her size. The Dwina is of only sixty tons burden, and the cargo she brought to Charlottetown consisted of 84,000 feet of spruce boards. There has been a large increase in lumber shipments to P. E. Island this year, owing to increased building operations. One Charlottetown firm has imported an average of a vessel load a day.

**POLICE COURT.**—At the Charlottetown Police Court this morning the adjourned case of assault and battery of Harry Cabill vs Pius Mahar, Patrick Mahar and Herbert Mahar resulted in the first two mentioned being dismissed and the latter fined \$10 or 30 days. The quarrel referred to took place at Grafton St. crossing, near the pork factory, and the case was first tried and was adjourned from Saturday morning.

**HELPFUL MEETING.**—Considering the busy season there was a good attendance at the Stanley-Cavendish Women's Institute meeting on Thursday. The supervisor described the different processes in cake making; various methods of mixing, with the reasons for each; how to overcome certain faults in cake; and the general theory of cake making. All of this was explained in detail and the members found the discussion very helpful. Pastry making also occupied the attention of the meeting and different methods were exchanged among the members.

**NEW FOX COMPANY.**—Mr. Harry R. Sherwood, a lawyer of Westport, Conn., and New York City will leave New York, Oct. 28th and will cross by the S. S. Empress, Oct. 29th, to P. E. Island. Mr. Sherwood's visit to the Island is to look into the fox industry, and organize a company. The foxes will be ranched at Foxall Ranch, at Mill River, R. R. No. 5, now owned by Mr. Geo. D. Warren, and will be of American capital. The people talked with in Maine, Mass., Conn., and New York, are greatly interested no doubt. Mr. Danbury Bradley, President of the company is president of the Westport Savings Bank. Mr. Sherwood will go to O'Leary Station, then to Alberton, Summerside, Charlottetown accompanied by Mr. Warren.

**A TRAVELLER'S OPINION.**—W. B. Arthur, who is just back from Prince Edward Island, reports that fall business over there is excellent and that much money is still being made in the fox industry. He told the Halifax Maritime Merchant of several instances that had come under his personal notice, where men had put in very small amounts of money and had made quite substantial fortunes. Mr. Arthur thinks the boom in the fox industry will be good for a long time yet.

**FAREWELL.**—A very large delegation of friends gathered at the C. P. R., station last week to farewell the Misses Kitchen, who were leaving Fredericton en route to Vancouver (B. C.), to join their parents Mr. and Mrs. Willard Kitchen, who are well known in Charlottetown and who have taken up their residence there. During the past couple of weeks the Misses Kitchen have been much feted, many social functions having lately been made in their honor.

**INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITS.**—The following reference to a former Islander is taken from the report of the Chilwick, B. C., first exhibition:—One of the most attractive exhibits at the fair was Fred Semple's case of blacksmith's work. The case contained an inkstand with a horse's hoof at a base, shod and bound with a hammered shoe and ink wells. The tiny forge with man, anvil and hammer and a rose bush with blooming roses bespoke the handiwork of Mr. Semple. A dozen or more shoes of different styles and shapes completed the exhibit. These shoes with one exception and special ones used in the correction of faulty action in the gait of a driver or a track horse. Each is hand forged and polished from mild steel.

**OAT MARKET.**—The oat situation in Canada depends a great deal upon the United States where the shortage this year is said to be 400,000,000 bushels or equal to Canada's total crop, says the Halifax Maritime Merchant. The American duty used to be 15 cents a bushel, but the new tariff is 10 p. c. or equal to about 5 cents per bushel. We observe that prices in the United States today are 10 cents higher than Canadian, so that it looks as though there would be a chance for an export trade for us at a slight advance on what we are getting in the home market at the present time. Prince Edward Island oats are quoted at 48 to 49 cents in bags delivered Halifax, and Manitoba are worth about 47 to 51c. according to grade. These prices are lower than were obtained for old crop last month and consequently there has been a slight decline in both rolled oats and oatmeal.
