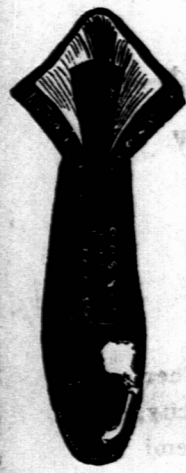

The insubordinate militiamen who in defiance of orders appeared before the Duke in Ottawa in Khaki to receive their medals are not likely to be punished. A court of inquiry was appointed to deal with them, but after one meeting it was adjourned, and report says it will not be called together again.

Three Justices of Peace for Prince County have called a public meeting at Tignish on the 29th instant, to consider the two questions of better train service for the West and winter communication between Summerside and Cape Tormentine. Members of the Dominion and Local Parliaments are invited to be present and hear what the people have to say.

The St John Telegraph says it is learned on good authority that the cost to the Provincial Government of the Royal Reception in St. John will be between \$30,000 and \$40,000. The City voted \$5,000 for its share of the various functions, but the expenditure probably reached \$8,000. This brings the public outlay in St. John up to something between \$40,000 and \$50,000.

Dr. Sproule, M. P. succeeds the late Hon. Clarke Wallace as Sovereign Grand Master of the Orange Order in British America. Being Vice President at the time of Mr. Wallace's death, Dr. Sproule succeeds to the highest office as Vice President Roosevelt succeeded President McKinley. Dr. Sproule is 58 years of age and has represented East Grey, Ont. in the House of Commons since 1878. He is a strong Conservative in politics as most of the Ontario Orangemen are.

doctors is a clean shaven, single man, while if he is both married and bearded he becomes a menace to the community which he serves with milk. A Mr. Mabee, who is described as a lifelong Conservative, has written a pamphlet of 95 pages against Mr. Whitney, the Opposition leader in Ontario. This indicates something of a family quarrel in the Opposition camp which the Ontario Liberal Association propose to turn to account by circulating Mr. Mabee's pamphlet as a campaign document. It is thought worth while to circulate 2,000 copies in each riding, the cost of the pamphlet being \$40 per thousand copies. This is simply a reversal of the incident in which Mr. Herman Cook on the eve of the last Dominion election denounced the Liberal leaders with whom he had been all his life associated. Mr. Cook did not annihilate Sir Wilfrid Laurier, and it is probable that Mr. Whitney will survive the attack of Mr. Mabee, whoever the latter may be.
