Trotzky Is Boasting Of Bolsheviki Army

Says He Will Investigate New War on Poland

LONDON, April 27—Leon Trotzky, addressing the students passing out of the military school in Moscow, declared, according to despatches, that the Bolsheviki army now counts millions of fighting men with 150,000 officers, while the output of the Russian munitions factories increased 400 per cent. in 1920.

Meantime, advices received in London, indicate increasing activity on the part of insurgents in Siberia and the Ukraine, which the Bolsheviki have been unable to suppress. The advices state that the soviet government delivered an ultimatum to the Ukrainian rebels to surrender their arms, declaring otherwise their villages would be burned.

Soviet newspapers reaching London admit that a serious situation exists in Siberia, and state that orders have been telegraphed to the local Soviets to hire Chinese troops and German and Austrian prisoners.

ROME, April 27—Sporadic disorders in connection with the forthcoming elections still continue. At Parma a mob clubbed a carabinieri to death. More than 100 persons were arrested.

The workmen's organizations have issued manifestoes asking the people to be calm, and urging them to work energetically.

In Pavia, Signor Maffi, Socialist member of the Chamber of Deputies, was surrounded by Fascisti, who ordered him to cry "Viva Italia." Maffi replied that he had never been unpatriotic, but refused to yield to dictation.

The Fascisti damaged the chambers of labor in Massafra and Tolosano. They set fire to the chamber of labor in Lavagna.

HAMILTON, Ont., April 23—The ownership of a little bean of the common ordinary garden variety was in dispute in a \$5,000 damage action in the Assizes here today.

The case was that of William and Isabella Gilbert against A. McDougal for compensation for personal injuries received by Mrs. Gilbert, who slipped on a bean in question in front of the defendant's stall on the market nearly a year ago. She was so badly injured that she had to be brought into the court room on a hospital cot.

The plaintiffs lost the case because there was no evidence to prove that Mr. McDougal owned the bean on which she fell.

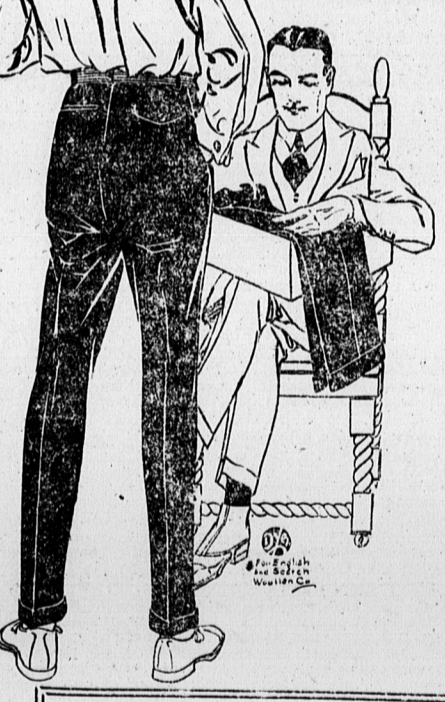
