**PROMOTION**—The following from a Montreal exchange will be of interest in this Province and especially in Charlottetown, as Mr. Casey made many friends here while T.P.A. for the C.P.R. W. C. Casey, one of the youngest officials of the C.P.R., is leaving Montreal tomorrow for Winnipeg, where he has been appointed general agent for the Atlantic and Pacific steamship service of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Mr. Casey's promotion in the Canadian Pacific service has been rapid. He is not yet thirty years old, but his appointment to this responsible position in the west is merited by his faithful service with the company. Mr. Casey has been in the employ of the C.P.R. for eleven years. He was born in Moncton, N.B., and entered the employ of the C.P.R. as ticket clerk in Halifax in 1902. In 1903 he was appointed travelling passenger agent for the Maritime Provinces, with headquarters at St. John, N. B., and this office he held until 1910, when he was appointed chief clerk to the general passenger agent, Atlantic Steamship Lines, at Montreal. In his new office as general agent Mr. Casey will be in charge of practically all the steamship passenger business of the company on this coast.
