## THE CONTROVERTED ELECTION BILL

An important change has been made by the Legislature in regard to controverted election petitions. Hitherto a petitioner might present an election petition to the Courts by giving security for costs to the amount of \$600. And if a corrupt act were proven to have been committed by the member elect, or by any one of his agents the seat would be declared vacant by the Court. The changes now brought in require (1) the petitioner to make a deposit of \$600 instead of merely giving bonds for that amount; (2) the election will not be avoided for corrupt practices by agents unless it is proven that a sufficient number of votes have been influenced by such corrupt practices to change the result of the election, and (3) the law is made retroactive by being made to apply to election petitions now pending.

We think the retroactive clause a decidedly objectionable one. The return of a number of the sitting members has been petitioned against and the petitioners have given security for costs as required by law. They have a just right to go on with the proceedings under the law as it was when their petitions were filed in the Court. This right is now taken away by the action of the Legislature, in which are a number of members who are personally interested in having the petitions abandoned. The petitioners must within a very few days each put up \$600 in money or find themselves out of court. This action of the Legislature looks suspiciously like "whitewashing". We certainly think that no member against whom a petition is now pending ought to have voted for the retroactive clause.

The other provisions of the amending Act are less objectionable, and precedents for them can be found in legislation elsewhere. But we have little doubt that any member who has been petitioned against and who has now voted for the changes in the law, should be by any chance be unseated, would find himself at a disadvantage on coming before the electors again. There is a strong love of fair play among the people of all free countries and the retroactive clause referred to does not seem quite like fair play.

It is noted that in the great fur sales at London, the fur market of the world, in March last there was a distinct decline in prices. A few lines only maintained the high prices of last year, while in others, silver fox, cross fox, fisher, mink, marten, lynx and other furs there was a decline of 15 to 75 per cent.

Now that all the industries and great enterprises of the world are being organized into immense trusts it is not surprising to find that a big agricultural implement trust is being formed with a capital of \$50,000,000. It is said to be the intention to combine all the industries in this line with a capital of \$100,000 each and over. Where will this combine business end?

In six weeks past over 50,000 immigrants have landed in New York and nearly half of them were Italians. In the year 1900, 100, 135 Italians landed in the States out of a total of 424,734 immigrants for the year. Austria-Hungary sent more than Italy by 14,000, and Russia only a few less. Thus these three countries each contributed to the population of the United States in one year a number of people equal to the total of one of the less populous of Canadian Provinces.
