CABLE CENSORSHIP.—Strict censorship has been established on cablegrams to Great Britain and Europe. Messages must be in plain English or French and no code or cipher is allowed. All telegrams must be fully addressed and signed, no registered code addresses allowed. The above censorship is also extended to Newfoundland.

BANNER OAT CLUB.—The Department of Agriculture is receiving a great number of enquiries regarding the Banner Oat Club. The Banner Oat Club is not a close corporation. Any one who conforms to the rules is at liberty to join and there is no entry fee. But before any oats can be offered for sale through the Banner Oat Club it must be inspected in the field by one of the judges of the Field Competitions, and must score not less than 194 points out of 20 for freedom from other varieties and other kinds of grain. It must be clearly understood that none who are not entered in this competition can be members of the Club, nor can they market their oats through the Banner Oat Club. There is no reason now why there should not be a great many entries in these competitions. 45 prizes for oats are offered in each county, or 135 prizes in the whole Province, and up to the present time there has never been 100 competitions in oats. The wheat generally fills, but last year there was only one entry for barley in East Queens. On account of the late season, entries can be made at the Department of Agriculture up to August 15th.

## AROUND THE FUR RANCHES

The spread and growth of the fox industry continues to manifest itself in the numerous flotations of fox companies and fur-raising companies which are occurring throughout the

mainland.

From Montreal the following report comes:—"Fur farming promises to be one of the most successful of the industries springing up along the line of the Grand Trunk Pacific Rail way. At several points west of Graham fur ranches have been established. Mackintosh, Sunstrum and Hudson being among the points chosen. A Prince Edward Island company is also making arrangements to establish itself in this territory. Black foxes are the mainstay of these fur farms, but silver, red and crossed foxes are also being bred."

It is in New Brunswick, however, that the development of the industry seems to be making unusually great strides. Besides the several companies whose incorporations were recently reported in these columns, a number of other organizations are seeking incorporation.

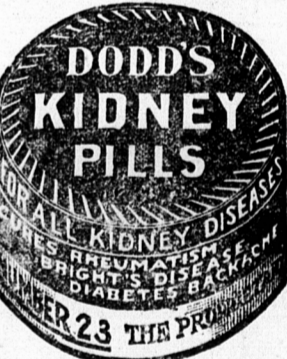

gin, and T. J. Trueman, of Searle-town, P. E. I., are applying for incorporation as Gaspereaux Silver Black Foxes Limited, with an authorized capitalization of \$99,000, with head office at Port Elgin.

In addition to the above, the Consolidated Fur Farms, Limited, has been federally incorporated with its head office at Sunny Brae, N. B., and with a capital stock of \$150,000.

Locally, letters patent have been granted for the incorporation of the First National Exchange of P. E. I., Ltd., with a capital of \$100,000; and the "Cherry Island Silver Fox Co., Ltd." with a total capital stock of \$350,000.

"The Central Fox Co., Ltd." is applying for power to increase its capital stock from \$22,000 to \$60,000, divided into fifty-dollar shares.

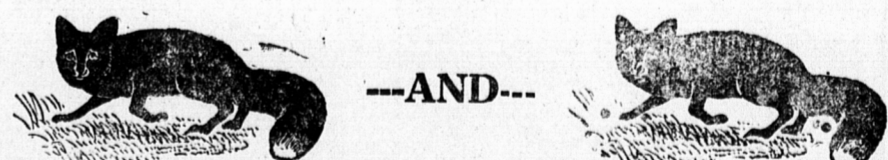
