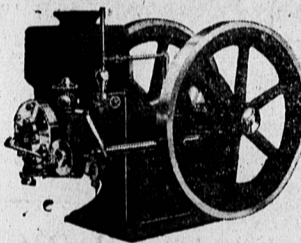

Still other wise physicians contend that the trouble is purely mental, owing to a run-down condition, and the prognosis is so doubtful that its affairs should be wound up. In any case the trouble is grave enough. The labor unions resent the idea that the clock should go on strike so frequently while continuing to work. Ninety-eight respectable people with excellent watches which they set by hearing the town clock striking have been humiliated by finding their always correct time keepers wrong by several hours and some have lost big money in bets that they were within a minute of the town time. Laborers have been known to quit work two hours before the day's close and lovers don't know when to go home at night. Only the other night one of these enjoying a lovely time, with the lights turned down, on suddenly hearing the town clock strike one, hurriedly kissed his innamorata on the nose and ran the length of ten blocks, only to find by the mantel clock in his home that the time was just 11.15. Dinner time, supper time, church time, bed time, and club time have all been set astray and in confusion by the clock. Something must be done or half the town will soon be as crazy as the clock.
