AN INDIAN TOWN IS DEMOLISHED

By Terrific Landslide on Thompson River, B. C. The Tragedy Witnessed from C.P.R. Train Twenty Indians Killed, Many Horribly Mangled, River Choked up.

VICTORIA, B. C. Aug. 14.—(Special)—Passengers on the Transcontinental Limited witnessed the destruction of an Indian town on Thompson River yesterday afternoon by a gigantic land slide.

The river was swept from its bed by the landslide, while earth and rocks filled the stream to a depth of forty feet. The railway escaped damage as it was well above the stream.
