**Good Service In Cause Of Humanity**

LONDON, November 17.—Commenting on the announcement from Washington that instructions have been sent to the American Charge d'Affaires at Berlin to take up with the German government the matter of deportation of Belgian civilians to Germany, the Manchester Guardian says the plain man will think this amounts to protest, adding:

"If, therefore, such a measure is conveyed to the German Chancellor, we welcome it, not because any change in the German policy is likely to follow, but because, it is, at any rate, a declaration that the latest German offensive concerns not only the powers at war, but America, also, and by inference, the whole of humanity."

While short of a formal judgment on some of the "German abominations in the conduct of the war," the Guardian says America "is doing good service in the cause of humanity and giving powerful reinforcement to the cause of the Allies when she pronounces, however informally, her opinion of German conduct of the war. Mr. Wilson's second term has opened auspiciously."

**BRITAIN ASKS U. S. TO BACK UP BELGIUM.**

LONDON, Nov. 17.—In a statement made to the Associated Press today Lord Robert Cecil, Minister of War Trade, uttered a vigorous protest against Germany's deportation of Belgians and declared that the people of France and England, less than the people of Belgium, will show itself, not only in a few short days or weeks of protests and criticisms, but in steady pressure upon the invaders of Belgium, to conduct the war against the soldiers of the Allies in the trenches and not against the helpless civilians whom they have in their power.

Lord Robert continued: "They have drained Belgium dry and stripped her bare, and we know all this policy was deliberately calculated to create a maximum amount of unemployment in order that when the proper moment arrived their slave raids might begin."

"Lastly, it must be remembered that the Allies can and will liberate that Belgian territory. Meanwhile they can and will bear the burden of keeping the Belgians from starving. But they cannot protect the Belgians from slavery."

**MYRIAD STARS IN GIANT REFLECTOR.**

PASSADENA, Cal., Nov. 18.—Nearly 100,000,000 stars, so faint that no astronomical instrument yet made will show their light, and many of them lying beyond the boundary of the universe as at present known, may be revealed when the new 100-inch reflector is put in place at the Mt. Wilson solar observatory of the Carnegie Institution of Washington, located 6,000 feet above the sea level on the summit of Mt. Wilson, near Pasadena. The completed instrument will represent several years of work and closest co-operation on the part of the astronomers and skilled workmen.

The new instrument is not in the usual sense of the word, a telescope with a long tube through which the student peers at the heavens. The 100-inch glass is not a lens, but a reflector, like a mammoth mirror. The instrument will be used, not for looking at the stars, but chiefly for photographing them by their own light, obtaining their spectra and studying their motions.

The mirror will be 101 inches in diameter, the largest of its kind in the world. The next largest is on Vancouver Island, Canada, and is 72 inches aperture. Since the light-gathering powers of such a mirror is in proportion to its area, the new instrument will gather twice as much light as the Canadian mirror and more than twice as much as the 60-inch instrument now in use on Mt. Wilson. Consequently the astronomers will be enabled both to photograph much fainter stars than at present and to study more closely the spectra of brighter stars to determine their composition.

**BRITAIN MAY STOP MANUFACTURE OF LIQUOR.**

LONDON, November 17.—A motion that the manufacture of intoxicating liquor in Great Britain should be prohibited will be made in the House of Commons, according to notice given by a group of members, after the speech last night of Walter Runciman, president of the Board of Trade on the food situation.

The members of the group, the notice stated, will move that this prohibition should be imposed, in view of Mr. Runciman's grave statement respecting the shortage of corn, sugar and other foodstuffs.
