STEAMER LENA WAS CLOSE TO TITANIC.

PORTLAND, Me., April 24.—Had the freight steamer Lena been equipped with a wireless outfit she could have reached the scene of the wreck of the Titanic in time to have saved many lives. The Lena which arrived here from Povey, England, today was within thirty miles of the Titanic when the latter foundered.

Chief officer Ellis said that those on board the Lena did not know of the wreck until they took a pilot on board off Portland. Three ships passed the Lena on April 14th, the day of the disaster. The first was the tramp steamer Ketsviale, Liverpool for Lonsberg, N. S., which have in sight at 1 p. m. and passed the Lena three hours later about 8 p. m. A passenger steamer which appeared to have four masts, passed and during the evening a ship supposed to have been a freighter also passed her.

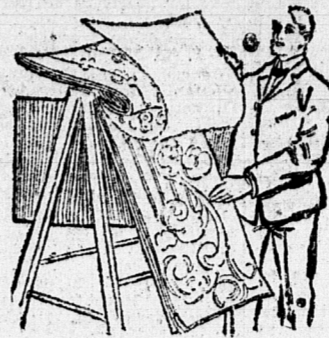

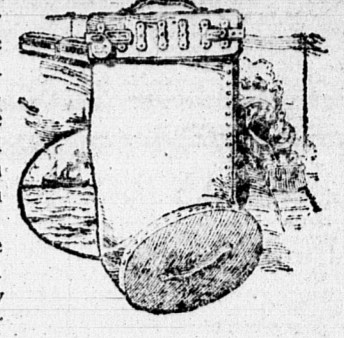
