On the evening of Oct. 28th, a very beautiful pageant was held in Pownal Church under the auspices of the Pownal W. M. S. those participating being from Pownal and Montague.

238 YEARS OLD.
Mrs. Cecil Wightman. This dress is well over two hundred years old and is hand sewn throughout. It was worn by Anne O'Halloran at her marriage in Ireland to George Douglas. It was brought to this country by their daughter, Catherine Anne, who was then Mrs. Alley. These people settled near Cardigan at what is still known as Alley's Mills.

60 YEARS OLD.
Mrs. Cecil Beck - This was the wedding dress of Miss Charlotte Machon, a daughter of Mr. William Machon of White Sands. She was married to Mr. Charles T. Brehaut of Murray Harbor, father of Miss Brehaut who wears one of the next dresses, on March 18, 1858, at the bride's home, the Rev. Mr. Bethune, Methodist minister. This lady did not live very long, and Mr. Brehaut afterwards married the lady who was Miss Brehaut's mother. Worn tonight by Mrs. Cecil Beck.

66 YEARS OLD.
Miss Jessie MacGowan. - At the residence of Judge Edward Hodson, 1872, by Bishop Hodson - Ann McKinnon, Mount Buchanan, was married to Capt. Murdoch Murchison formerly of Point St. Charles, on the occasion of her marriage to Mr. Isaac Burden of Fyfe-erion, N. B. The marriage took place at her mother's home in Pownal on July 29, 1905 and was performed by the Rev. Daniel R. Chowan, Methodist minister then in charge of Pownal circuit. The greater part of their married life was spent in Montague. Dress worn by her daughter, Miss Lucille Burden.
