THE CENTRAL GUARDIAN

IT PAYS to buy in this Province. (From Yesterday's Evening Guardian) THE EXPRESS.—The express arrived in Charlottetown last night at 11 o'clock.

THE NORTHUMBERLAND.—The S. S. Northumberland docked in Charlottetown last night at 8.15. THE CASCAPELIA.—The S. S. Cascapeia arrived in Charlottetown last evening at 5 o'clock returning from Pictou. She sailed for Montreal at an early hour this morning with a large cargo consisting chiefly of potatoes, canned lobsters and eggs.

ISLAND REAL ESTATE.—There is a rumor current that the Island Real Estate and Investment Company has ceased operations. This is not so. The Company has simply suspended activities in the sale of investments, stocks, bonds, etc., and is giving its whole time and attention to promoting Island real estate. They are undertaking operations in this direction of a stronger character than ever and anticipate an active boom for the Island this coming fall.

HUNTER RIVER.—The people of Hunter River were more than startled the other evening, when the news went around that Mr. D. McLeod was sun-struck; but their minds were soon at ease and their fears lessened, when the news became publicly known that he was only presented with a "bouncing baby boy." Congratulations.—Mr. Lorne Higgins, South Melville, has returned home after visiting his son in Hunter River.—Mr. A. Stewart, section man, Hunter River, has recently built an exceptionally beautiful fence, that has added much to the beauty of her home.—Her friends are pleased to learn that Mrs. (Dr.) Rodgeron is recovering from her recent illness, and hopes to see her around again.—Miss Gertrude Ling, Oyster Bed Bridge, is visiting in Hunter River, the guest of Miss Edna Nicholson.

A BIT OF HISTORY.—For thirteen years the Province of New Brunswick was a portion of the Diocese of Charlottetown, P. E. Island. In the fall of 1842 it was erected into a separate diocese, and on June 11, 1843, seventy years ago, Wednesday—Very Rev. William Dollard was made bishop of it. Dr. Dollard was born in Ballytarina, County Kilkenny, Ireland. He was Vicar General of the Diocese of Charlottetown. Whilst stationed at Fredericton he was appointed bishop and was consecrated at Quebec. He was called to his reward on August 29, 1851. The Very Rev. Mgr. Thomas Conolly—a name to conjure with in this diocese in the latter part of the nineteenth century—was ordained a priest by Bishop Dollard at Chatham on July 29th, 1848. Shortly afterwards there was published a pamphlet entitled "Fifty Years a Priest," a biographical sketch of the reverend gentleman. The following reference is made to the subject of this article: "The first Roman Catholic Bishop of New Brunswick was above all else a pioneer bishop. He lived before the age of dudes, and was not cut on a clerical fashion plate. With him substance outweighed shadows, and reality counted for more than mere appearance. His long missionary career as a priest in Quebec, Labrador, Prince Edward Island, Cape Breton and New Brunswick gave him a unique experience of men and conditions."
