VANCOUVER, B. C., April 5.—The Vancouver members of the Canadian Alpine Club are up in arms over the announcement from Ottawa that Mr. A. O. Wheeler, president of the Alpine Club, has been refused the usual week to lead the members of the club in their annual camp in the mountains of British Columbia. For the past three years Mr. Wheeler has been the ruler of the camp, and this year elaborate preparations were made, invitations having been sent out to receive any noted visitors. Mr. Wheeler is prominently connected with the Geological Survey of Canada, and now the Government has announced that his duties will not permit him to devote the usual week to the Alpine Club. As Mr. Wheeler is the leading spirit, this will mean, unless the action is rescinded, that the annual camp may have to be cancelled.

BARK LUARCA ABANDONED.

BALTIMORE, April 7.—Captain Dodge and a crew of ten men, of Windsor, N. S., of the bark Luarca, from Turk's Island were brought to this city by the German steamer Walkure. The Luarca left Turk's Island March 13th and encountered head gales and heavy seas. She sprang a leak and on last Friday morning when the Walkure came up she was abandoned in a sinking condition. Shortly before his rescue, Capt. Dodge fell down the companion way and broke his leg. The vessel was owned by C. D. Smith of Windsor.
