THE Convention of the Kensington District S. S. Association was held in the Presbyterian Church at Clifton on Thursday, July 14th. The day was fine and the attendance was large, though not so many schools were represented as was hoped for. The afternoon session met in the hall and the devotional exercises were conducted by the president, John Johnson, of Long River. After the reading of the minutes the roll of schools was called and nine reported. Rev. R. S. Whidden reported on behalf of the committee appointed at the last convention to consider financial matters. He stated that the district was asked to raise the sum of \$125.00 for the provincial work. There are five congregations in the district and this would average \$25.00 per congregation. The Field Secretary gave a blackboard lesson on "A Teaching Method," and illustrated it by a S. S. lesson taught in accordance with the principles of the method. The evening meeting was held in the church, Jas Carruthers of North Bedouq leading the devotional exercises. A paper on "The relation of the church to the Sunday School" prepared by the Rev. John Murray, was on account of his unavowed absence read by the Field Secretary. Mr. Murray pointed out clearly the intimate and vital relationship between the two. The Sunday School is the means the church uses to nurture and train her young people. Rev. R. S. Whidden gave a very helpful address on "The relation of the home to the Sunday School." The home must co-operate with the Sunday School in the training of the young people if the moral and spiritual results are to be secured. Rev. Mr. Young, of Margate, spoke briefly but forcibly on the need of qualified teachers, who can inspire their scholars to think of God and of their relation to Him. The Field Secretary spoke on "The child for Christ," and showed the necessity of studying the child, of understanding his nature and the laws of his physical, mental and spiritual development, if he is to be kept for Christ all through his life. James Carruthers spoke briefly on the importance of S S work and touched on various phases of the work. He also moved a vote of thanks to the session of the church, to the choir, and to people for their kindness to the delegates. The motion passed heartily. The meeting then closed in the usual way.

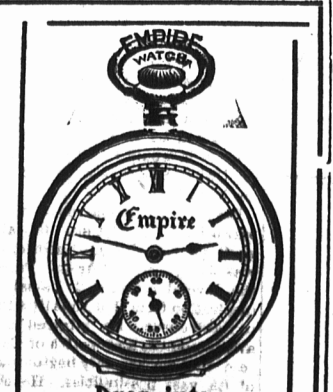

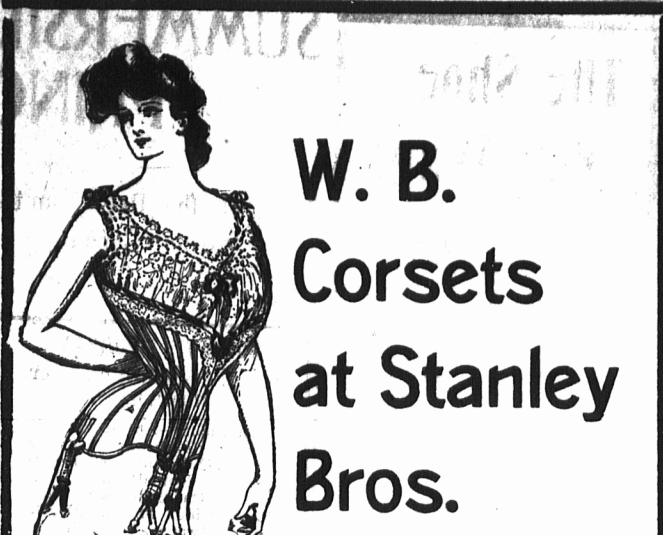
