OF SPECIAL INTEREST

LONDON, Aug. 6 (Special).—Premier Asquith received a signal tribute from a political adversary last week, when The Pall Mall Magazine said: "In these days when there is over-much prating of Irishmen, Scots, and Welshmen, he stands out a great Englishman."

The testimonial is given in consequence of the fact that the Premier's second son, Cyril, has taken high honors at Oxford University, following the example of his father and elder brother, Cyril, by the way, was recently fined for driving a motor without lights.

The Asquith family's university record, though remarkable, is exceeded by that of the Butler family. Lord Justice Fletcher Moulton and his son, Hugh, were both Cambridge wranglers.

LONDON, Aug. 6 (Special).—Bulgaria has submitted counter proposals to the demands of the allies at the Bucharest peace conference, according to a telegraphic despatch from Bucharest, Roumania, to the Exchange Telegraph Company.

The Bulgarian proposals stipulate that the frontier line shall start at the old Bulgarian boundary and run southward between the Vales and Egri-Palanka, thence between Vales and Istip, across the Vardar River to Mirochovo, near Monastir, and then by way of Moglen, Geogel and Kilkish and to the west of Seres across the Struma River to the Gulf of Orfani.

Such a frontier would give Bulgaria possession of the town of Kociana, Istip, Strumaitza, Seres and Kavala.

Bulgaria declined to recognize the allies' claim for an indemnity or to enter into any negotiations concerning that subject.

COURMAYEUR, Aug. 9 (Special).—Mr. Jenkins Alexander Stuart, of Baltimore, had a narrow escape from destruction yesterday morning while climbing Mont Blanc with two Swiss guides, one of whom was killed when a fall of ice from the glacier threw the three men, who were roped together, down a precipice. Mr. Stuart and the guide Gaudin managed to save themselves, but the guide Rieder was killed.

CHINESE AND JAPS NEAR SETTLEMENT. AMBOY, China, Aug. 9.—An early settlement is considered probable of the differences between the Chinese and Japanese in regard to the adjustment of the recent claims disputes in this city, in which a number of Formosans were killed. The negotiations, however, are making slow progress.

JAPS LOOKING FOR COLONIES.

TOKIO, Aug. 9th.—Scrutiny of the Pacific coast of North and South America and the South Sea Islands, for the promotion of productive colonization, is the announced object of the Japan Exploration Society, recently formed for the general purpose of inaugurating Japanese exploration.

The first expedition will leave in September for a two years' cruise on a 115-ton schooner. The course for the cruise includes the Luzon and Bonn Islands, the South Sea Islands, the coasts of Brazil and Chile, and the Pacific shores of North and South America.

The schooner will then visit Cuba and the coast of Africa and later make her way through the Mediterranean Sea. On the homeward trip she will touch at several points in India and Australia. S. Takeda, a graduate of the Japanese Nautical College and a seasoned sailor, will be the captain of the little vessel.

The exploration society is composed of a number of influential Japanese, and it enjoys the support of Fleet Admiral Ito.

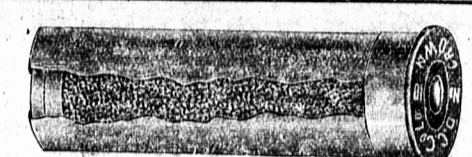

IN MEMORIAM

REV. JAMES A. McDONALD

There passed to his eternal rest at 12 o'clock on Saturday night, one of the oldest members of the Catholic clergy of Prince Edward Island, in the person of Father James Aeneas Macdonald.

Father McDonald was born at Pisiquid in the year 1840.

He first attended St. Dunstan's College and later entered the Grand Seminary where he pursued his studies until November 1867, when he was elevated to the Holy Priesthood. After his ordination he was stationed at Vernon River as Curate. His first parish was Casampec, which at that time included Bloomfield, Alberton and Lot 7, where he ministered for a number of years until he removed to Kelly's Cross and St. Ann's, Lot 65.

He held this parish until he became parish priest at Hope River. He removed from Hope River some years ago to become Parish Priest at St. Columbus, East Point. Here he labored faithfully and well in the service of the Lord until about a year ago when his retirement became necessary owing to ill-health. Immediately after his retirement he entered the Charlottetown Hospital where he remained with very little change in his health until about two weeks ago when he took a turn for the worse from which he never recovered.

Father McDonald was a son of Margaret and Angus (Ban) Macdonald, of Pisiquid, and some of his family survive him.

The late Father McDonald was a noble, generous-hearted man and noted for his charity among the poor. He was a good shepherd, always ready to administer to the wants of his flock and after his long and faithful ministry the call to rest came as the call to a worthy servant.

The funeral takes place on Tuesday morning from the City Hospital to the Railway Station, where a special train will leave, with the remains, for St. Andrew's for interment.

A gloom was cast over St. Peter's Road, Cardigan, on Sunday, July 27th, 1913, by the death of Elizabeth Sharkey, beloved wife of the late Michael Flynn, in the sixty-fourth year of her age.

She was a kind neighbor, a devoted and loving mother, and will be greatly missed by all who knew her.

\$50,000 LOSS IN FIRE AT PEABODY. PEABODY, Aug. 9.—The municipal electric power and light plant was destroyed by fire early today.

The loss was \$50,000. The town will be in darkness tonight, for there is no power for electric lights and it will be three weeks before arrangements can be made to get power from Salem. Many of the leather morocco factories here are run by electricity, and these will be forced to shut down.

PRISONER ESCAPES JAIL.

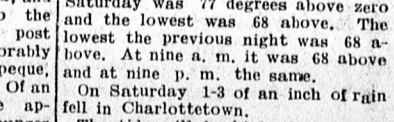
