**POLICE COURT.**—One case, Helen Boyle vs. Peter Weatherbie, a charge of assault was before the Charlotte town police court Saturday and was adjourned till Tuesday.

**INWARD TRAINS.**—The western express arrived in Charlottetown Saturday at 11.30 a. m., on time and the Summerside accommodation at 5.35 p. m., one hour and twenty minutes late.

**THE BOOM ALREADY ON.**—The Guardian understands that a farm near Carleton Head, the terminus of the Car Ferry, was sold recently for just double the amount paid for it about ten years ago. An increase of one hundred per cent in the value of land near the Car Ferry terminus means a proportionate increase in land values elsewhere throughout the province. This sale makes the beginning of the boom at Carleton.

**MORE INCORPORATIONS.**—In the Royal Gazette of the 1st inst., there are notices of application for the incorporation of two fox companies in addition to those in previous issues and already noted. The new companies are "The Samson Silver Black Fox Co., Limited," the applicants being Benjamin Rogers, Governor of Charlottetown; Horatio Nelson, Montague; J. Ewen Matthews, Brandon Man.; Wesley Newsome, Charlotte town; David Schurman, Charlotte town. The Smith Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd., capital \$150,000, the applicants being John W. Carruthers, Montague; Robert A. Taylor, Montague; H. A. Powell, St. John, N.B.; Herbert McLean, St. John, N.B.

**DEATH AT SEA.**—The death occurred at sea on November 18th last, of Captain Neil McLeod, son of Jas. McLeod of Orwell. He was about 40 years of age and a cousin of ex-Governor MacKinnon, who received the sad news from San Francisco and forwarded it to the parents of the deceased in Orwell. The late Capt. McLeod left San Francisco in October last in the best of health and spirit for Iquique and the only news of his death was by a cable via Europe, which leaves a widow and family in San Francisco. The deceased was a very skilful navigator, and one of the finest men who ever left Orwell. He had risen by sheer ability to be master of one of the largest steel ships sailing out of San Francisco.

**LARGE ALLOWANCES.**—The Maritime Provinces want larger allowances from the Dominion treasury, and this morning, says an Ottawa exchange, they applied to the government for increases, giving reasons why their requests should be granted. The application was made on behalf of Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, and was presented to a full meeting of the Dominion government by Attorney General Grier, of New Brunswick, and Premier Matheson, of Prince Edward Island. The recent enlargement of the provinces of Ontario and Quebec were made the basis of the demand. It was pointed out that the lands bought from the Hudson Bay Company in 1870 were bought for the whole Dominion and paid for out of the general fund. Vast sums have been spent by the Dominion upon the development of these lands, and although the eastern provinces contributed they were not directly benefited. Now from this same domain and other domains belonging to all of the provinces, the areas of Quebec and Ontario have been increased. In 1872 two sections of each township were set apart for school purposes, and while this amounted to an eighteenth part of the public lands in Canada, none of it was in the Maritime Provinces, and they got no benefit from it. The area added to Ontario last year was 93,696,000 acres, and to Quebec, 354,961 square miles. The Maritime Provinces had contributed to the original purchase price of this land, and for this and similar reasons they should be given a compensation. The amount was not specified. Premier Borden stated that the matter would receive the careful attention of the government.
