Probable Sad Fate of Captain Sanderson at Montevideo, S. A.

Considerable anxiety has been aroused over the probable fate of Capt Sanderson, son-in-law of Mrs Robblee of this town. Capt Sanderson whose wife died about two years ago and whose little daughter resides with her grand mother has always kept up a frequent correspondence but has not been heard from since a year ago last May when he wrote Mrs Robblee from Tampa, Florida, that he was about to sail in the schooner Independent for Baltimore. Recent endeavors to locate him have proved futile and fears regarding his safety were followed yesterday by the supposition that he has met a sad fate. This supposition is brought about by a statement made by Capt. Albert Allen of the steamer Kili-keel now in port that he about a year ago while in the ship Charles S. Whitney at New York read a despatch in one of the papers that a Captain Sanderson of the barkentine Rachael, owned by John S. Emery, Boston had been stabbed to death by a sailor at Montevideo, South America and that the accused sailor was being sent by the American Consul to New York for trial. The despatch also stated that the murdered man belonged to the Maritime Provinces. Whether or not this was the Captain Sanderson who belonged here his friends are left in doubt, but further inquiries will be made.



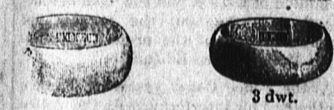

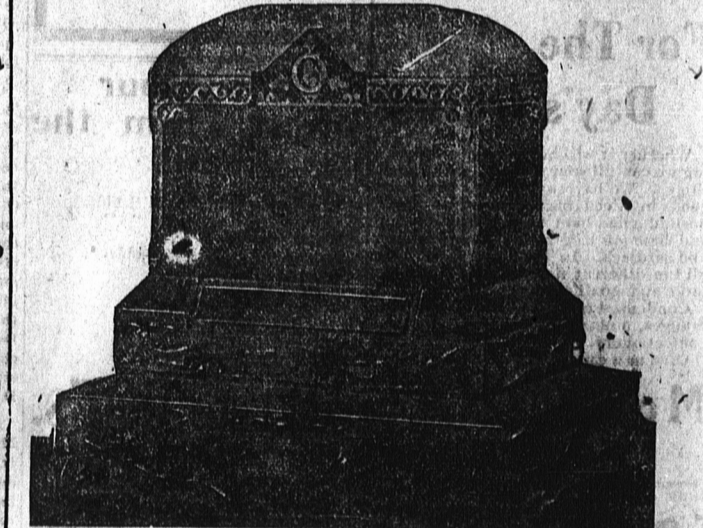
