DO YOU DO THIS?

When beating upholstered furniture in the house, place a damp cloth over the pieces. The dust adheres to the cloth.

An alarm clock kept in the kitchen may be set to ring at the time the vegetables should be put over the fire, or the hot bread or the cake or pudding is due to be done.

Candles will last much longer if they are placed on ice and kept there for twenty-four hours before using.

Before putting the stew pan on the fire, rub some laundry soap over the bottom several times, and when the pan is washed the black comes off like magic.

When soiled stockings are taken off, pin them together with a small safety-pin. In this way no stockings are ever mislaid or lost.

Rubbing rusty knives with a damp cloth dipped in ashes will make them bright and shining.

To keep a fine gloss on your varnished floors, sprinkle with course salt; let remain for five minutes, then sweep off with a soft broom.

When buying a carpet for stairs get an extra yard, and turn it under at each end. When the carpet begins to wear on the edges of the steps, it can be slipped either up or down and equalize the wear.

The best way to clean wall paper is to cover a board four by twelve inches with a piece of sheep felt, tacking it on firmly. Then fasten on a long handle. Brush the walls in the ordinary way.

To deodorize saucers after cooking onions, cabbage, or fish, wash and dry the pan, then place a piece of thick brown paper on the stove, set fire to it and turn the saucer over the blaze. After a few minutes remove it and the odor will not be noticed.

A dish-mop for blackening the stove will save the hands from a disagreeable soiling. Keep a mop for this purpose only. When it is new, wind a cord several times around the handle, in using the mop moisten it before dipping in the blacking and applying to the stove.

The tunnel through the Jungfrau toward its top has been completed. Ultimately tourists will be taken to a point within a few hundred feet of the summit by an elevator.

The "shilling dinner" long supplied to British members of Parliament at a cost of about 36 cents, is objected to as an unnecessary charge on the public who that members receive salaries of £400, and may be abolished.

Mixed vs Unmixed Fertilizers.

While most of the fertilizer materials can safely be mixed together some little time before applying, it is unwise to mix some of the ingredients, particularly if they are to be left for any length of time. Basic Slag and Quick Lime must never be mixed with Sulphate of Ammonia, or the valuable Ammonia will be lost. Acid Phosphate and Nitrate of Soda, when mixed together, should not be kept long in sacks, as the sacks are liable to rot away in a very short time. The Potash Salts may be safely mixed with all other fertilizer materials.

By buying the various "ready mixed" brands of fertilizers on the market, the farmer does not have the "trouble" of mixing but the cost per acre is quite 25 per cent to 30 per cent higher than when separate ingredients are used. Should the farmer, however, decide to use the former, great care must be taken to obtain a thoroughly reliable brand. Unfortunately too many of the mixed fertilizers, the ingredients are obtained from substances that do not become available for one, two or even three years after application.
