Lawson Little Blasts Way Into Final Round To Oppose Walter Emery

CLEVELAND, Sept. 13.—(A.P.)—William Lawson Little, jr., blasted his way into the final round of the United States amateur golf championship today by shaking off the threatening jinx of Friday the 13th and simultaneously crushing the challenge of his rival and room-mate, Omaha's Johnny Goodman.
