STRIKE REACHES CLIMACTIC STAGE Graphic Tale Of Horror Told By Survivors Of Liner "Morro Castle"

LABOR VIEWS BEFORE BOARD OF ARBITRATION

Many More Answer Strike Call as Orderly Procedure Towards Peace Is Sought.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—Labor's proposal for an end to death and disorder in the U. S. textile strike brought a promise today from the manufacturers' leader to talk things over with President Roosevelt's arbitration board.

Spurred by a deadline late tomorrow after which Labor said its offer would be withdrawn, Chairman John G. Winant of the board telephoned George A. Sloan of the Cotton Textile Institute in New York. He agreed to come to Washington tomorrow.

Made Public

Subsequently, Winant made public a telegram he sent to Sloan saying:

"The union, as you know, has submitted to this board a proposal

Gold, and more gold, confronted the few people strolling along the docks at Plymouth, but few noticed the precious metal and there were no American gangsters to carry it off, so the dirty bullion was carelessly dumped on a truck and wheeled away. This sounds like a fairy story, but every word is true. The salvage ship "Artiglio" had arrived in port with approximately \$1,000,000 in bullion and coin which had been brought from the strong room of the "Egypt", lying in a watery grave in the Channel. Here we see Captain Bruno, of the "Artiglio", with Mario Raffalli, the salvage officer and chief diver who was mainly responsible for the success of the undertaking. Note the gold bullion and coins. For two and a half years this boat has been salvaging precious metal from the "Egypt" and it is estimated that more than \$50,000,000 have been brought to the top.

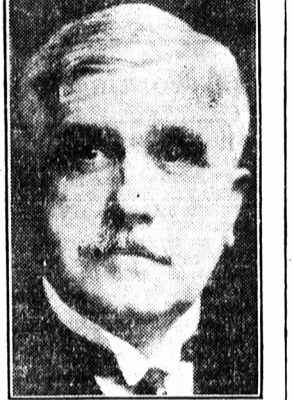
Cattle Dying Of Thirst In Yarmouth Co.
