Islanders Meet In Far Off France

The following interesting letters have been received by Mrs. Catherine Hughes from her son Peter:— 4, 1916.

My Dear Mother, Well here we are into the New Year and the end of this war business seems as far away as ever. It will shortly be a year since the last Contingent reached France, full of hope, strong, healthy and spoiling for a scrap. Today the few of us who are left still at the front can look back upon a year of crowded events. Personally I have much to be thankful for. Death has often closely passed me by, my friends are scattered, many are buried in Flanders, some in Germany, some in Canada, all totally incapacitated. Some in England in Hospitals and convalescent homes and a few of us here still going through the old routine of monotonous trench work and exciting moment of strife. Still with all the hardships and troubles I have rarely if ever regretted the day that I made up my mind to take an active part in the Great World Drama. I intended to have written several letters when on my pass but the penalty is very great, if it is found out that a person takes advantage of his leave to send any news away that he dare not send from here, so we shall have to possess our souls in patience until peace has once more come and we are safely united once again.

The artillery is very active now as infantry attacks are out of the question on account of the mud and wet. This you must know has a harrowing effect on the nerves, but I must not matter how shattered I may be during the actual bombardment, I very quickly regain my normal self again. You will often see in the papers accounts of artillery duels. What an artillery duel really consists of is to bombard as fiercely as possible the infantry of the opposite party. The real sufferers in this war, do not know whether I have told you or not Reggie Walsh of Mount Stewart. He looks well. I went across country about eight miles to visit the Island boys in the 26th Batt. but they were in the trenches. One day we were marching a long and met another body of Canadians and I am perfectly sure I saw Mick Jarvis from Grand Tracadie. I did not have a chance of speaking to him but shall likely meet him again. The winter here is awfully miserably and wet, the mud is heavy and many thousands of soldiers put the road and in fact the whole country in a deplorable condition. We get wet and muddy and of course we have very little chance of drying out. This causes a great deal of rheumatism and neuralgia, but it is strange that if we lived under the same conditions in Canada, our experience would be short, but of course here we are kept in the best physical condition possible through marches, etc., and thus we are able to stand what we could not if our lives were more pampered. I received a dainty parcel from Chilliwack friends also from Mrs. Webber. The parcels are held up pretty bad as
