HOW VOTES WERE POLLED.—At the recent election for a Mayor and three Councillors for the town of Summerside, 613 electors cast their ballot of which 22 were laid aside as spoiled of the remaining 591 all but 4 voted for mayor. For councillors 503 voted, for three councillors, 56 voted; for two councillors while 32 could only find one of the candidates to their liking. Of the 593 who voted for three candidates, 37 were successful in picking the three successful candidates as well as the candidate for Mayor while 75 others voted for the same candidates except the mayor. In the total number of votes cast there were 75 different combinations of ballots. With Mr. Saunders for Mayor,

With Morrison for Mayor McFarlane received 2, Gallant 7, Jardine 4; Moore 2; and Schurman 2.—J.
